

POSTGAME NOTES

CLEVELAND BROWNS VS. CINCINNATI BENGALS | FIRSTENERGY STADIUM | DEC. 8, 2019

- The Browns have won their past four games at FirstEnergy Stadium, their longest home winning streak since 2007 when the club won seven consecutive. The club's .572 winning percentage at home is the third-highest at FirstEnergy Stadium (since 1999).

- The Browns have recorded their first season in which they have defeated all three AFC North division opponents.
- The Browns improved to 3-1 in divisional play, their highest winning percentage since the formation of the AFC North in 2002.

- CB **Denzel Ward** recorded five tackles, two passes defensed, one interception and one touchdown. In the first quarter, he returned an interception 61 yards for a score, marking the Browns first interception returned for a touchdown since **Jason McCourty** on Oct. 15, 2017. Ward has four career interceptions.
- RB **Nick Chubb** led the team with 106 rushing yards to increase his season total to 1,281. It is the most rushing yards by a Brown since **Jamal Lewis** recorded 1,304 in 2007. Chubb's 1,281 rushing yards currently ranks ninth in team history. Chubb's 98.5 rushing yards per game are the most by a Brown since **Jim Brown** averaged 110.3 in 1965.

- Chubb recorded 117 scrimmage yards (106 rushing, 11 receiving). He has recorded at least 75 scrimmage yards in 13 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NFL and the longest such streak by a Brown in team history. The previous record was 12 games set by **Jim Brown** in 1961-62.

- Chubb recorded a 57-yard run in the third quarter, he has eight runs of 40-plus yards in his career and four this season.
- Chubb has six 100-yard rushing games this season and 11 in his career. He is the first Brown with six 100-yard rushing performances in one season since **Leroy Kelly** had seven in 1968.
- WR **Jarvis Landry** recorded four receptions for 76 yards His 919 receiving yards this season are the fourth-most by a Brown in the first 13 games and his 69 receptions are tied for the sixth-most.

- QB **Baker Mayfield** threw for 192 yards and added his third rushing touchdown of the season. Mayfield has thrown for 3,109 yards this season and is the first Brown to reach the 3,000-yard passing plateau in consecutive seasons since **Bernie Kosar** in 1986-87. Mayfield's 3,109 passing yards this season are the seventh-most by a Brown in the first 13 games. Mayfield's 6,834 career passing yards and 41 passing touchdowns are each the most by a Brown in their first two seasons.

- Landry's 550 receptions are the most all-time by an NFL player through their first six seasons.

- WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** and Landry each extended their streak of consecutive games with at least two receptions. Landry's stretch of 92 consecutive games is the longest active streak in the NFL, while Beckham is second at 72. Landry's streak is the sixth-most all-time.

- DT **Sheldon Richardson** recorded a season-high seven tackles with one sack. He has three sacks this season, all in the past three games. He has 26.5 sacks in his career.
- DE **Bryan Cox** was in on his first career sack as he split a sack with DT **Larry Ogunjobi**.
- Ogunjobi registered a career-high nine tackles with half of a sack. He is second on the team with 5.5 sacks this season.
- Rookie K **Austin Seibert** connected on both of his field goal attempts. He converted a career long 53-yard field goal in the third quarter, tied for the ninth-longest field goal in team history. For the season, he is 22 for 25 on field goals and 25 for 28 on PATs. He has scored 91 points this season, the most by a Browns rookie.
