

POSTGAME NOTES

CLEVELAND BROWNS VS. SEATTLE SEAHAWKS | FIRSTENERGY STADIUM | OCT. 13, 2019

- RB **Nick Chubb** led the team with 122 rushing yards and two touchdowns. He has six rushing touchdowns this season and 14 in his career. His six rushing touchdowns are tied for the fifth-most by a Brown through the first six weeks. Chubb has two 100-yard rushing games this season and six in his career. Chubb recorded a 52-yard run in the first quarter, he has six runs of 40-plus yards in his career. Chubb's 607 rushing yards are the sixth-most by a Browns through six weeks.

- DE **Myles Garrett** recorded two sacks. He has three multiple sack games this season and eight in his career. Garrett's nine sacks this season are the most by a Brown through the first six weeks of a season.

- QB **Baker Mayfield** threw for 249 yards and one touchdown. He added 35 rushing yards, including his first career rushing touchdown on a 10-yard scamper. Mayfield's 1,496 passing yards this season are tied for the fifth-most by a Brown through the first six weeks.

- S **Damarious Randall** recorded his second sack of the season.
