

POSTGAME NOTES

CLEVELAND BROWNS AT NEW YORK JETS | METLIFE STADIUM | SEPT. 16, 2019

- The Browns 20-point win was the team's largest margin of victory since a 24-3 win at Cincinnati on Nov. 6, 2014.
- The Browns improved to 16-15 on Monday Night Football and 25-32 all time in prime time games. The Browns have won their last three prime time games and their first on Monday night since a 29-27 victory at Buffalo on Nov. 17, 2008.
- The three points allowed by the Browns were the fewest by the team since a 24-3 win at Cincinnati on Nov. 6, 2014.
- DE **Myles Garrett** set a career-high with three sacks. It marked his seventh career multi-sack game. In three career games against the Jets, Garret has recorded seven sacks. Garrett's five sacks this season are leading the NFL and are the most by a Brown through the first two weeks of a season. He became the first Browns player to record multiple sacks in back-to-back games since LB **Jamir Miller** in 2001 and the first Browns player to record three sacks in a game since LB **Paul Kruger** on Oct. 26, 2014.

- In the third quarter, QB **Baker Mayfield** connected with WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** for an 89-yard touchdown. It was the fourth-longest pass play in Browns history and the team's longest since QB **Brandon Weeden** connected with WR **Josh Gordon** for 95 yards on Dec. 1, 2013.

- WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** recorded six receptions for 161 yards, including a career-long 89-yard touchdown. It marked his 25th career 100-yard game and his most receiving yardage in a game since totaling 222 on Oct. Oct. 16, 2016 as a member of the Giants. He has recorded at least three receptions in 59 consecutive games, the third-longest streak in NFL history.

- QB **Baker Mayfield** threw for 325 yards with one touchdown. It was Mayfield's fourth career 300-yard passing game. Mayfield has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of his 15 career starts, trailing only St. Louis' Kurt Warner (23 from 1999-00) for the most consecutive starts with a touchdown pass to begin an NFL career. Mayfield's streak of at least one touchdown pass in 15 consecutive games is the fourth-longest in Browns history.

- Beckham and Landry each extended their streak of consecutive games with at least two receptions. Landry's stretch of 81 consecutive games is the second-longest active streak in the NFL, while Beckham ranks fourth at 61.

- RB **Nick Chubb** led the Browns with 62 rushing yards, including a 19-yard touchdown. He added four receptions for 36 yards. Chubb has nine career rushing touchdowns and 11 total scores.
- S **Morgan Burnett** recorded a sack. He has one each game this season and 9.5 in his career.
- Rookie K **Austin Siebert** connected on field goals of 23, 43 and 48 yards. He tied the Browns single-game record for field goals by a rookie.
