

POSTGAME NOTES

CLEVELAND BROWNS VS. MIAMI DOLPHINS | FIRSTENERGY STADIUM | NOV. 24, 2019

- The Browns improved to 5-6, their best start since 2014 when the team started 7-4.
- Cleveland's 41 points were its most since scoring 42 at Tampa Bay on Sept. 30, 2018. Along with the 40 points the team scored at Baltimore earlier this season, this marks the first time the Browns have scored 40 points in a game multiple times in one season since 2007.
- The Browns have won three consecutive home games and improved to 3-3 at FirstEnergy Stadium on the season.
- LB **Joe Schobert** recorded five tackles, two interceptions and four passes defensed. He became the sixth linebacker in NFL history to have at least two interceptions in consecutive games and the first to accomplish the feat since Cato June in 2005.

- WR **Jarvis Landry** recorded 10 receptions for 148 yards and two touchdowns. He is the first Brown with a touchdown catch in four consecutive games since **Gary Barnidge** in 2015 and the first Browns wide receiver to accomplish the feat since **Kevin Johnson** in 2001. Landry has two 100-yard receiving games this season and 13 in his career. Landry is leading the team this season with 59 receptions and five receiving scores. Landry's 59 receptions are tied for the fifth-most by a Brown in the first 11 games.

- QB **Baker Mayfield** threw for 327 yards, three touchdowns and registered a 118.1 rating. Mayfield has thrown for multiple touchdowns in three consecutive games. During that span, the Browns are 3-0 and he has seven touchdowns and one interception. Mayfield has three 300-yard passing games this season and six in his career.
- Mayfield's streak of 157 consecutive passes without an interception was snapped in the third quarter. His streak spanned five games and was the sixth-longest in Browns history.

- Mayfield's 6,446 career passing yards and 40 passing touchdowns are each the most by a Brown in their first two seasons. His 2,721 passing yards this season are the fifth-most by a Brown in the first 11 games.

- RB **Nick Chubb** led the team with 106 rushing yards to increase his season total to 1,117. It is the most rushing yards by a Brown since **Peyton Hillis** recorded 1,177 in 2010. Chubb added a rushing touchdown and a career-high 58 receiving yards on three receptions. Chubb has recorded at least 75 scrimmage yards in 11 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NFL and the longest such streak by a Brown since **Leroy Kelly** in 1967. Chubb has five 100-yard rushing games this season and 10 in his career.
- Chubb's 1,117 rushing yards are the eighth-most by a Brown through the first 11 games. Chubb is averaging 101.5 rushing yards per game this season, the most by a Brown since **Jim Brown** averaged 103.3 in 1964. Chubb's 1,117 rushing yards rank 16th in team history.

- WR **Odell Beckham Jr.** recorded six receptions for 84 yards and one touchdown. He has two touchdowns this season and 46 in his career.
- RB **Kareem Hunt** rushed for 37 yards with a touchdown. It was his first rushing touchdown of the season and 16th of his career.
- DT **Sheldon Richardson** recorded five tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble. It was his third career multi-sack game. He has two sacks this season and 25.5 in his career.
- Landry's 540 receptions are the most all-time by an NFL player through their first six seasons.

- Beckham and Landry each extended their streak of consecutive games with at least two receptions. Landry's stretch of 90 consecutive games is the longest active streak in the NFL, while Beckham is second at 70. Landry's streak is the seventh-most all-time.

- Rookie K **Austin Seibert** connected on field goals of 26 and 40 yards. For the season, he is 18 for 21 on field goals and 21 for 24 on PATs. He has scored 75 points this season, the second-most by a Browns rookie.
