CLEVELAND BROWNS AT ARIZONA CARDINALS | STATE FARM STADIUM | DEC. 15, 2019

• RB **Nick Chubb** led the team with 127 rushing yards to increase his season total to 1,408. It is the most rushing yards by a Brown since **Jim Brown** recorded 1,544 in 1965. Chubb's 1,408 rushing yards currently ranks tied for fifth in team history. Chubb's 100.6 rushing yards per game are the most by a Brown since **Jim Brown** averaged 110.3 in 1965.

• Chubb recorded 148 scrimmage yards (127 rushing, 21 receiving). He has recorded at least 75 scrimmage yards in 14 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NFL and the longest such streak by a Brown in team history. The previous record was 12 games set by **Jim Brown** in 1961-62. Chubb is the first NFL player to record at least 75 scrimmage yards in the first 14 games of a season since Arizona's RB David Johnson accomplished the feat in the first 15 games of 2016. With 1,685 scrimmage yards on the season, Chubb is the only player in Browns history to surpass 1,000 scrimmage yards in each of his first two seasons.

- Chubb had one rushing touchdown to increase his season total to eight. He is the first Brown with at least eight rushing touchdowns in consecutive seasons since **Leroy Kelly** in 1968-69.
- Chubb has seven 100-yard rushing games this season and 12 in his career. He is the first Brown with seven 100-yard rushing performances in one season since **Leroy Kelly** in 1968. Chubb's seven 100-yard games are tied for the fifth-most by a Brown in a season.

• WR Jarvis Landry recorded five receptions for 23 yards to increase his season total to 1,018. He is the first Brown to eclipse the 1,000-yard receiving mark since **Terrelle Pryor** in 2015. Landry's 1,018 receiving yards this season are the most by a Brown since **Josh Gordon** (1,646) in 2013 and ranks 10th in team history.

Mayfield has thrown for 3,356 yards this season and is the first Brown to reach the 3,000-yard passing plateau in consecutive seasons since **Bernie Kosar** in 1986-87. Mayfield's 3,356 passing yards this season are the 12th-most by a Brown in a season. Mayfield's 7,081 career passing yards and 44 passing touchdowns are each the most by a Brown in their first two seasons.
