KEY NOTES

- Joined the Browns in 2020 and helped the defense rank among the league leaders in takeaways. Helped the Browns finish ninth in the league in run defense after finishing 30th in 2019.
- Spent 2019 as Missouri State's wide receivers coach, helping senior Tyler Currie earn All-MVFC honorable mention distinction. Currie ranked second in the conference in receptions per game (4.8).

- Served as a graduate assistant coach and worked with wide receivers at Wake Forest from 2017-18 after joining the program in 2016 as an offensive quality control coach. The Demon Deacons went to three straight bowl games in that span with the 2017 team setting numerous team and individual records, including points scored (459) and total offense (6,055 yards).
- Participated in the prestigious Bill Walsh NFL diversity coaching fellowship with the Minnesota Vikings in 2018, as well as the New York Jets in 2019.
- Began his coaching career at Waldorf University, where he spent the 2015 season coaching the wide receivers and helped mentor a pair of all-conference standouts. Also served as assistant director of football operations at Eastern Illinois and later mentored the EIU running backs during spring football in 2016 before moving to Wake Forest.
- Walk-on wide receiver at South Florida who earned a scholarship and lettered for the Bulls for three seasons. Played in 31 games and totaled 22 receptions for 259 yards. Used fourth year of eligibility to play at Eastern Illinois and caught 38 passes for 289 yards in 12 games. Earned tryouts for the Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.
- Earned the OVC Medal of Honor in 2014 after serving as team captain and leading Eastern Illinois to an appearance in the conference championship game.
- Is a 2014 graduate of South Florida and earned his degree in psychological studies. Earned postgraduate degrees from Eastern Illinois in 2015 and Wake Forest in 2018.
