NOTABLE STORYLINES

- This week, Cleveland (4-1) travels the Turnpike to visit the AFC North foe Pittsburgh Steelers (4-0) at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh, Pa., Sunday, Oct. 18 at 1 p.m. ET. The teams split last year's series, 1-1, with both teams winning on their home turf.
- In Week 5, the Browns continued their best start to a season in 26 years, defeating the Indianapolis Colts, 32-23, for the club's fourth straight win and a 4-1 record to begin 2020. The Browns have won four consecutive games for the first time since 2009, matching the longest win streak by the team since 1999.
- HC **Kevin Stefanski** became one of only six rookie head coaches since 2009 to have guided their teams to a season-opening record of 4-1 or better. He's the first Browns head coach to start his first year at 4-1 since Nick Skorich in 1971.
- QB **Baker Mayfield** tossed 21 completions for a season-high 247 yards and two touchdowns last week, catapulting the Browns to scoring 30-plus points for the fourth game in a row for the first time since 1968. Mayfield also passed Bernie Kosar for most passing yards by a Brown in his first three years (8,528) and completed his 700th career pass on the day.
- DE **Myles Garrett** registered a sack for the fourth consecutive game and now has 36.5 career sacks, passing Von Miller for the fifth-most sacks by a player in his first 42 career games. His total also passed Miller for the fourth most by a first-round draft pick in his first 42 career games. His six sacks on the year are second in the league, while his three forced fumbles are tied for first.
- WRs **Jarvis Landry** and **Odell Beckham Jr.** each extended their active streaks of games with two-plus receptions to 100 and 80 consecutive games, respectively, the longest active streaks in the league. Landry notched a season-high 88 receiving yards on four receptions, while Beckham Jr. added five receptions for 58 yards and an 18-yard pass for a first down.
- The game was Beckham Jr.'s 80th, eclipsing Torry Holt for the second-most receiving yards by a player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (6,805). He also passed Keenan Allen for the third-most receptions by a player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (485).
- S **Sheldrick Redwine** had his first career interception, while S **Ronnie Harrison Jr.** scored on the first pick-six of his career and first interception of the season. The Browns have recorded at least one takeaway in 12 straight games, the second-longest active streak in the NFL.

- RB **Kareem Hunt** led the game with 72 rushing yards on 20 attempts, along with three receptions for 21 yards and a touchdown. Hunt has scored six total touchdowns this year, the most by a Brown in the first five games of a season since Leroy Kelly in 1971.

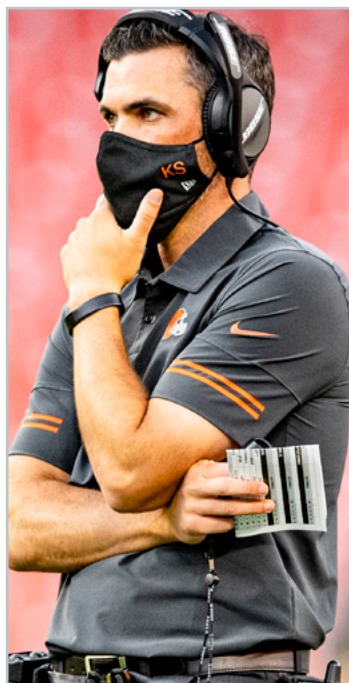

KEVIN STEFANSKI: 4-1, FIRST SEASON AS A HEAD COACH. FIRST WITH THE BROWNS.

On January 13, 2020, the Cleveland Browns announced the hiring of Kevin Stefanski as the 18th full-time head coach in franchise history. The 38-year old spent the past 14 seasons in various roles with the Minnesota Vikings. Prior to Cleveland, Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and elevated up the coaching ladder, serving as assistant quarterbacks coach (2009-13), tight ends (2014-15) and lone season (2016) coaching running backs. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games in 2018 before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019. Stefanski played defensive back at University of Pennsylvania.

MIKE TOMLIN: 137-73-1, 14TH SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, 14TH WITH THE STEELERS.

Mike Tomlin was named the 16th head coach in Steelers history on January 22, 2007. Tomlin became the youngest coach (36 years, 323 days) in NFL history to win a Super Bowl when the Steelers topped the Arizona Cardinals, 27-23, in Super Bowl XLIII. He has led Pittsburgh to six AFC North titles, eight playoff appearances, two trips to the Super Bowl (XLIII and XLV), and at least five home games won in each of his first 13 years. He also is one of eight head coaches in league history to achieve the 100 win mark in their first 10 seasons. Prior to joining Pittsburgh, Tomlin served time as defensive coordinator of the Minnesota Vikings in 2006 after five seasons (2001-05) as the defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

- Browns RB/run game coordinator **Stump Mitchell** and Steelers senior defensive assistant/secondary's coach **Teryl Austin** served on the Seahawks staff from 2003-06.
- Steelers HC **Mike Tomlin** (2006) was the defensive coordinator in Minnesota during Browns HC **Kevin Stefanski's** (2006-19) first season with the team. Browns DC **Joe Woods** (2006-13), STC **Mike Priefer** (2011-18), pass game coordinator/WRs coach **Chad O'Shea** (2006-08), and Steelers DL coach **Karl Dunbar** (2006-11) were also on the Vikings coaching staff.
- Browns OL coach **Bill Callahan** (2015-19) and Steelers WRs coach **Ike Hilliard** (2014-19) coached together in Washington. Browns QB **Case Keenum** was on the roster in 2019.
- Steelers STC **Danny Smith** (1995-98) was on the Eagles coaching staff with Browns OL coach **Bill Callahan** (1995-97).
- Browns STC **Mike Priefer** (2003-05) was on the Giants coaching staff with Steelers WRs coach **Ike Hilliard** (1997-04). Browns assistant OL coach **Scott Peters** (2003) and assistant special teams coach **Doug Colman** (1996-98) played for the Giants.
- Browns OC **Alex Van Pelt** (2018-19) was the QBs coach in Cincinnati when Steelers senior defensive assistant/secondary coach **Teryl Austin** (2018) was the defensive coordinator.

BILL WILLIS COACHING FELLOWSHIP

The Browns created the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship in 2020, which is intended for a rising minority coach with a focus on the offensive side of the ball. In the program, the coach spends a full season with Cleveland's coaching staff and assist coaches with week-to-week game plans and talent evaluations. The fellowship also provides the coach with a plethora of resources to network with other coaches, gain valuable knowledge on the implementation of NFL-level coaching methods and improve their path to a professional coaching career.

The team created the fellowship to provide opportunities and experience to minority coaches, who have historically faced barriers in their pursuit of entry-level positions and promotions. The fellowship was named after Willis, who along with teammate Marion Motley, overcame many obstacles to become two of the first African-American professional football players in the modern era. Willis played with the Browns from 1946-53 and was enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1977.

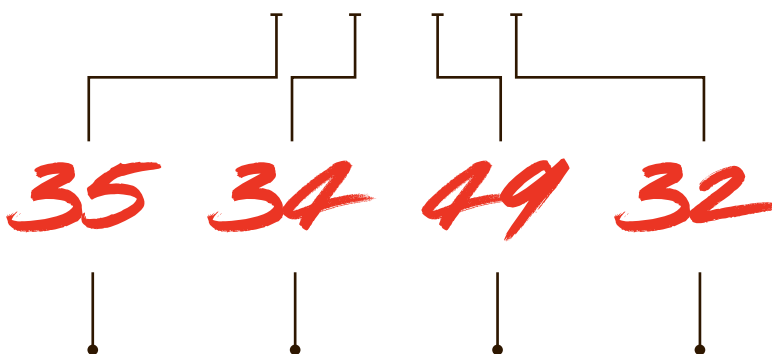
Ashton Grant was named the first-ever recipient of the Bill Willis Coaching Fellowship on July 14, 2020.

The streak of four games with at least 30 points ties the Green Bay Packers for the **longest active streak in the league**. This is the seventh time in history the Browns have reached this streak and it's the first time since 1968.

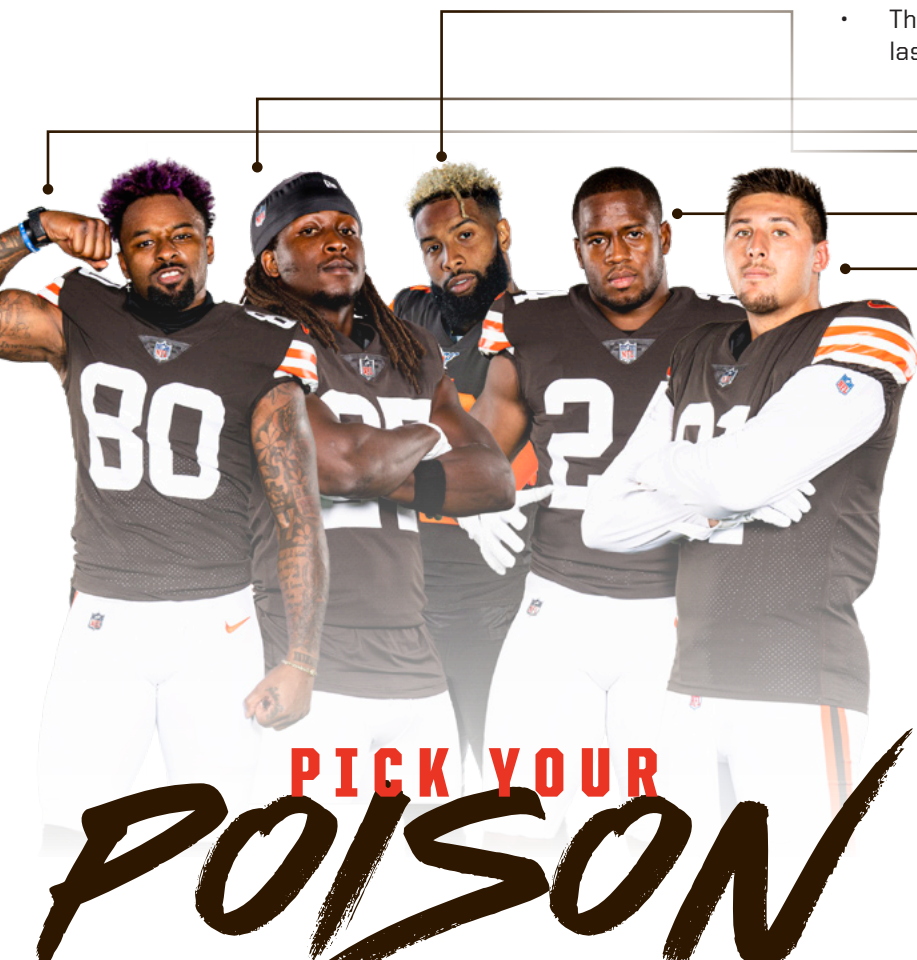
The Browns currently rank **tied for first in the NFL with a 6+ turnover differential**. The team has posted 12 takeaways (six interceptions and six fumble recoveries), while giving up four interceptions and two fumbles. The Browns are **undefeated** this season when they don't lose the turnover differential.

- The Browns have won four consecutive games for the **first time since 2009**, matching the **longest win streak by the team since 1999**.
- The Browns have won consecutive games in October for the **first time since 2014**.

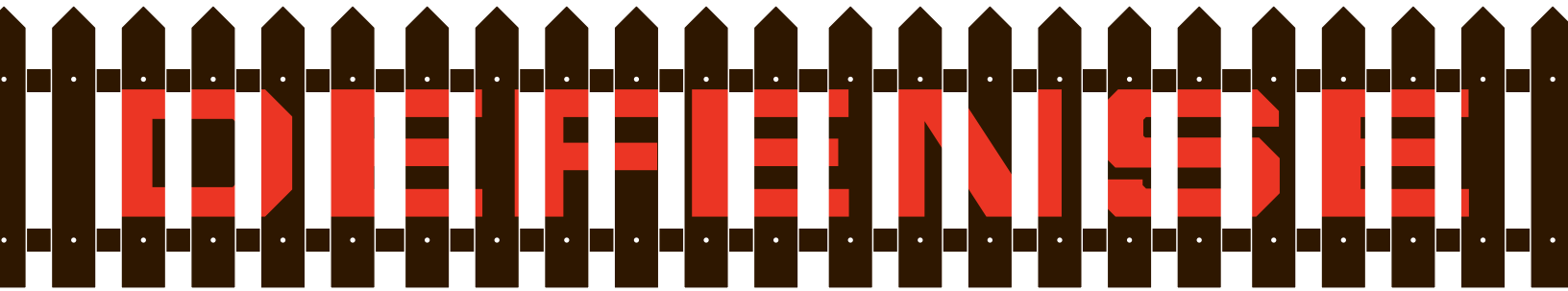

They're also the most points scored off turnovers by a Browns team in a contest since 2000.

- The Browns offensive line didn't surrender a sack in Week 2, one of just six performances in the NFL through five weeks this season that **hasn't allowed a sack in a given game**.

When the Browns departed Dallas following their 49-38 victory in Week 4 over the Cowboys, they left after achieving several milestones:

In Week 2, Chubb posted 133 scrimmage yards and two scrimmage touchdowns, while Hunt added 101 scrimmage yards and another pair of scrimmage touchdowns. It's the first time since the 2010 Giants in Week 13 (Brandon Jacobs and Ahmad Bradshaw) two running backs on the same team have posted 100-plus scrimmage yards and two-plus scrimmage touchdowns in a single game.

RUN FOR THEIR \$

When Hunt rushed for his first touchdown of the game in the second quarter of Week 4, he and Chubb became the third set of RB teammates each with at least four-plus touchdowns through four games in the Super Bowl era.

CAN'T STOP, WON'T STOP

The Browns have proven to be hard to take down since 2019, posting 1,556 rushing yards after contact since last season (second in the NFL). This year, the team ranks first in the category with 506 rushing yards after contact, the fourth-most YAC through the first four weeks of a season by any team since 2000. The team's 506 rushing yards after contact are also 191 yards better than the next closest team at 276 (Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

MAGIC TOUCH

Since last year, the Browns rank tied for sixth in the NFL with a 7.9 scrimmage yards-per-touch average.



DE Myles Garrett notched his **fourth**  **consecutive game with a sack** last week, tied for the longest active streak in the NFL and tied for a career high. He currently ranks **second in the NFL** with six sacks, adding three forced fumbles (tied for first) and two opponent fumble recoveries (tied for first). The pair of fumble recoveries also rank Garrett first in total takeaways among all defensive linemen. Additionally, Garrett is tied for third in the league in quarterback hits (10) and tied for fourth in pressures (15). He now has 36.5 sacks in his career, the **fifth-most sacks by a player in his first 42 career games** and the fourth most by a first-round draft pick in the same span. Garrett is currently **fifth in sacks in Browns history**.

- In his fourth year of serving on the Waterboys organization and his second as the active player captain. The foundation works to bring clean water to communities in need in East Africa. In his role as captain, Garrett leads a team of active NFL players committed to using their platform to engage their fans in the clean water crisis. Since its launch, Waterboys has funded 83 wells serving more than 350,000 people.

Garrett is just the 17th player since 1991 to have at least 36.5 sacks and nine forced fumbles in his first four years. He's seen action in just 42 career games, fewest on the list, with the next highest number of games played being 51. Garrett is the only NFL player since 1991 to have reached those numbers in 42 career games or fewer.

Garrett's nine career forced fumbles are already the most among Browns in history who have played in four seasons and are tied for the most among all Browns since 2000. His career total is tied for eighth in the league since he entered it in 2017.

Garrett has posted 18 sacks in 21 games played on the road since 2017, seventh in the NFL, while his 18.5 in 21 games played in Cleveland are tied ninth in the span. His six forced fumbles at home are tied for the third most by a player since 2017.

The game marked Hunt's 20th contest with 50-plus scrimmage yards and a scrimmage touchdown since 2017 and **his teams have gone 17-3 during those instances.** His six total touchdowns are the **most by a Brown** in the first five games of a season since Leroy Kelly **in 1971.** His 14 receiving touchdowns since 2017 are **tied for third** by a running back since that time. Hunt has totaled seven games with at least 50 scrimmage yards and two touchdowns, tied for ninth among all players in the NFL since 2017. He's also tied for fourth in the NFL with five games consisting of at least one receiving touchdown and one rushing touchdown since 2017.

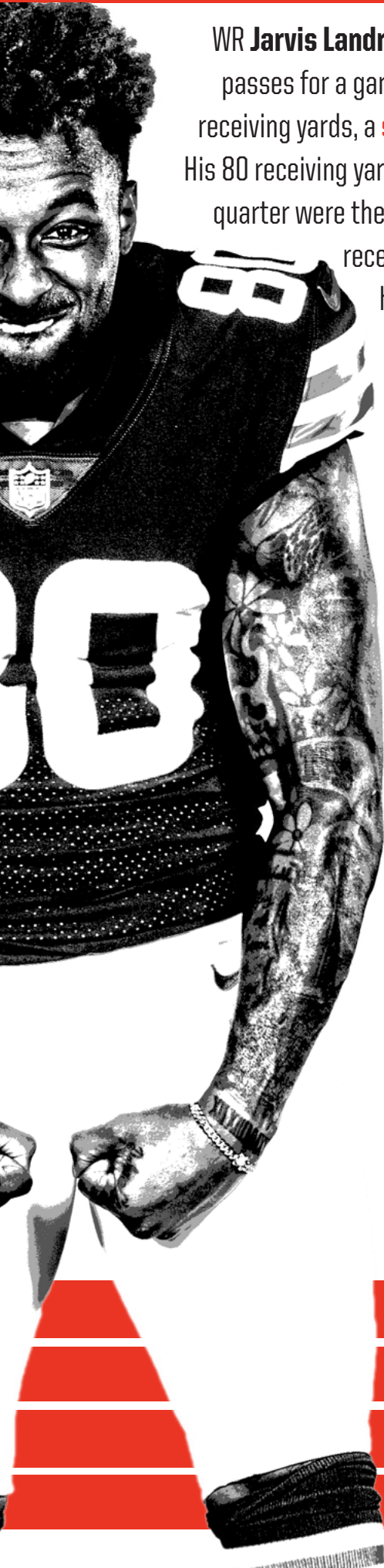

WR **Jarvis Landry** caught four passes for a game-leading 88 receiving yards, a **season high**. His 80 receiving yards in the first quarter were the second-most receiving yards of his career in a first quarter.

The game was also his **100th consecutive game catching at least two passes**, the longest active streak in the NFL and the fifth longest streak in NFL history.



CATCHING ON

7th Landry is currently tied for 10th in NFL history for receptions in a player's first seven years (585). His 581 receptions total ranks fifth in NFL history in a player's first 100 games.

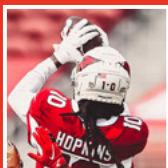
In his 100th career game in Week 4, Landry recorded five receptions for 48 yards and tossed his first career touchdown pass on the Browns' first drive of the game, a 37-yard pass to WR Odell Beckham Jr. (his 50th career receiving score). The pass was Landry's sixth attempt in his career and first touchdown. He now has 109 passing yards since 2014, third in the NFL by a WR since that time, behind WRs Mohamed Sanu (135) and Beckham Jr. (144). He's also 2-2 for 100 yards and a touchdown in his last two passing attempts. It was the first touchdown pass by a Browns WR since Mohamed Massaquoi in Week 16 of 2010 and the longest passing touchdown by a Browns WR in history.

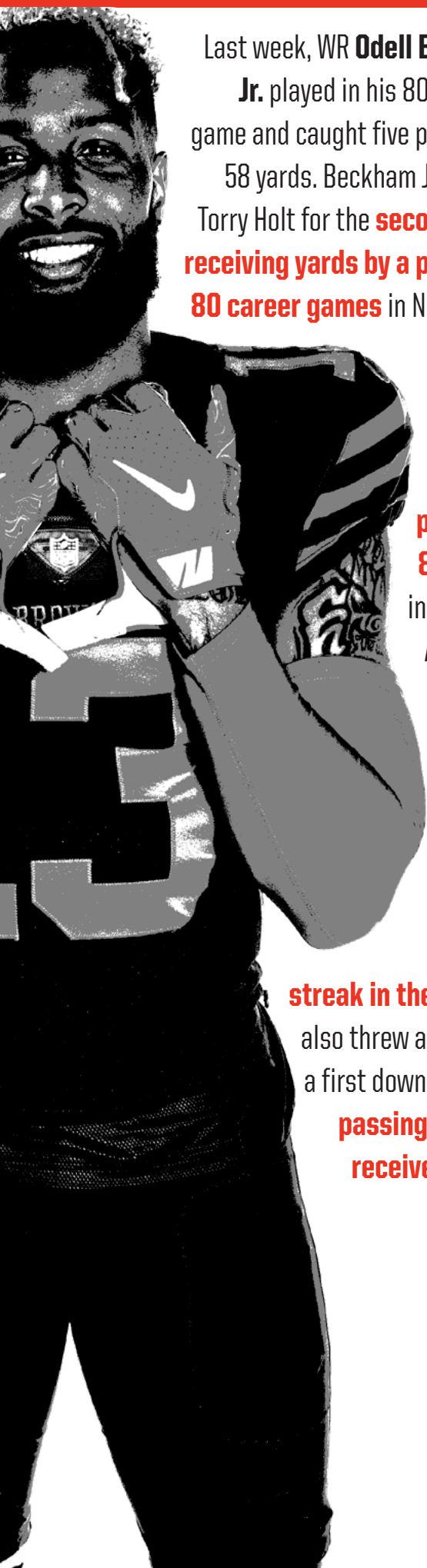

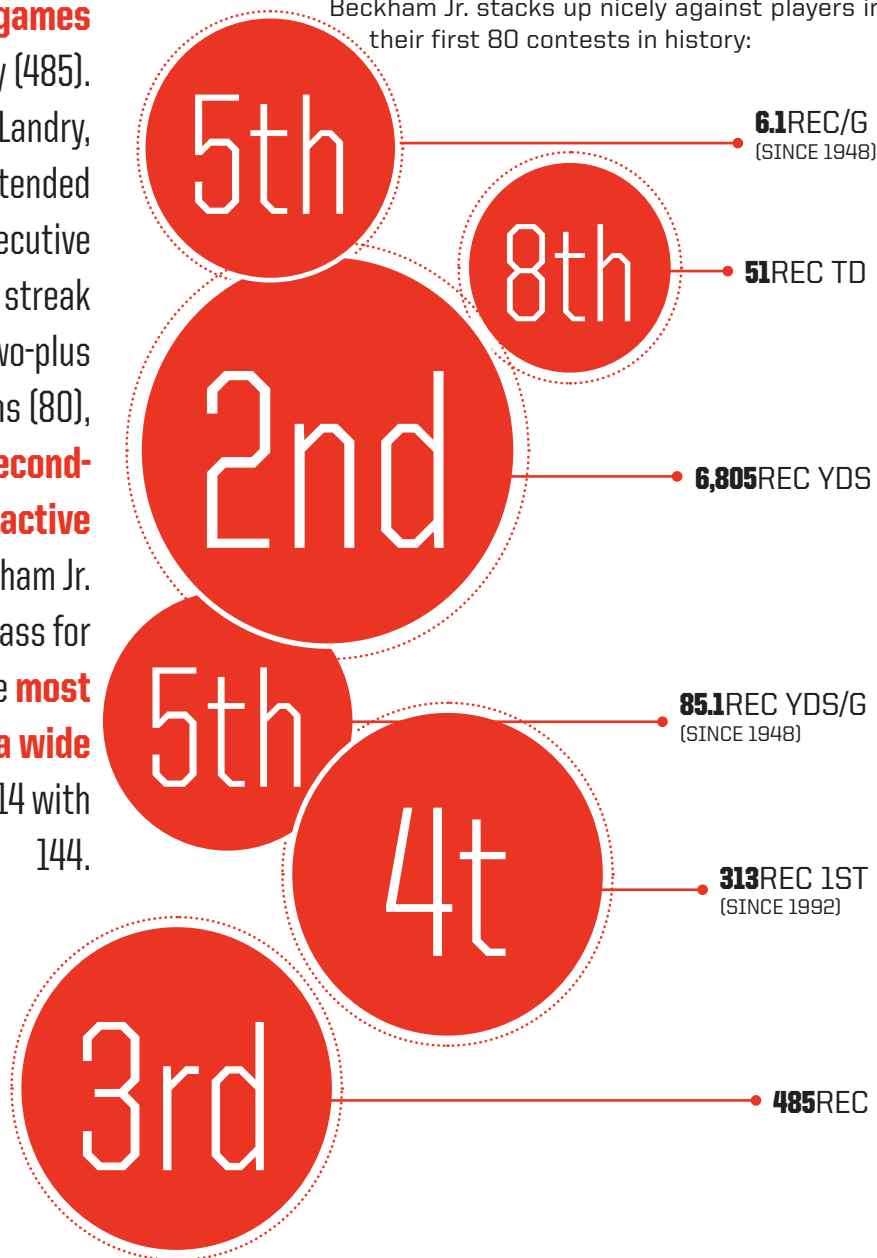
He also eclipsed Keenan Allen for the **third-most receptions by a player in his first 80 career games** in NFL history (485).

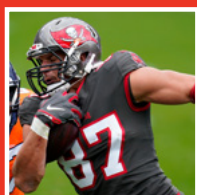
A DAY TO REMEMBER

Week 4's contest was one of WR Odell Beckham Jr.'s most prolific performances as a Brown, recording five catches for 81 yards and two touchdowns, along with two rushing attempts for 73 yards and his first career rushing score. His 50-yard rushing score was the longest by a non-running back in Browns history. He tied his career high with three total touchdowns in the game and became the fourth NFL receiver with at least two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in a single game since 2000. He received his 50th career touchdown pass from Landry in the game, 37 yards for the longest recorded touchdown pass by a receiver in Browns history. He also became the first Browns player with a 30-yard receiving touchdown and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game since 1966 (Leroy Kelly).

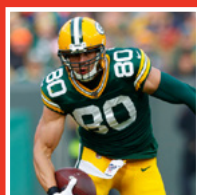
TWO TUDDIES

With at least two receiving scores in 12 games since entering the league in 2014, Beckham Jr. ranks tied for third in the NFL in that category in an active player's first seven years. Since being drafted, he's also second to Antonio Brown's 15 games and is tied for seventh all time for most multi-touchdown games in a player's first 70 contests and tied for sixth in a player's first 80 games.

In Week 5, QB **Baker Mayfield** tossed 21 completions for a **season-high 247 yards** and two touchdowns. Mayfield passed Bernie Kosar for **most passing yards by a Brown in his first three years (8,528)** and is now just nine passing touchdowns back of Otto Graham for the most passing touchdowns in Browns' first three years with 58. He also tied Bill Nelsen for sixth on the list of Browns with the most career games with at least two passing touchdowns (19). Mayfield completed his **700th career pass** during the game and his 132 passing yards in the first quarter were the most in a first quarter of his career. He's currently **tied for ninth** in the NFL with nine passing touchdowns.

A PAIR OF SCORES

Mayfield is currently one of seven quarterbacks with an active streak of four or more games with two-plus passing touchdowns.

BACK-TO-BACK BAKER

After Week 4, Mayfield registered three consecutive games with a 100.0-plus passer rating and at least two passing touchdowns for the first time in his career. The Browns are 11-1 when Mayfield posts a 100.0-plus passer rating, 10-1 when he posts a 100.0-plus passer rating and a passing touchdown and 8-1 when he posts a 100.0-plus passer rating and multiple passing touchdowns. The team is also 8-2 when Mayfield completes at least 69 percent of his passes.

TE **Austin Hooper** posted a **season-high** 57 receiving yards on five receptions last week in the Browns' win over the Colts. Hooper is in his first season with the Browns after posting his best season in 2019, catching 75



passes for 787 yards and six touchdowns to land his second consecutive Pro Bowl invitation. The

Stanford product entered the league in 2016 and since that time, Hooper has 226 receptions for 2,340 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Among all tight ends in that span, his receptions rank sixth, his receiving yards a rank ninth and his receiving touchdowns rank tenth. Additionally, his career long touchdown reception of 88 yards is the longest by a tight end since 2016.

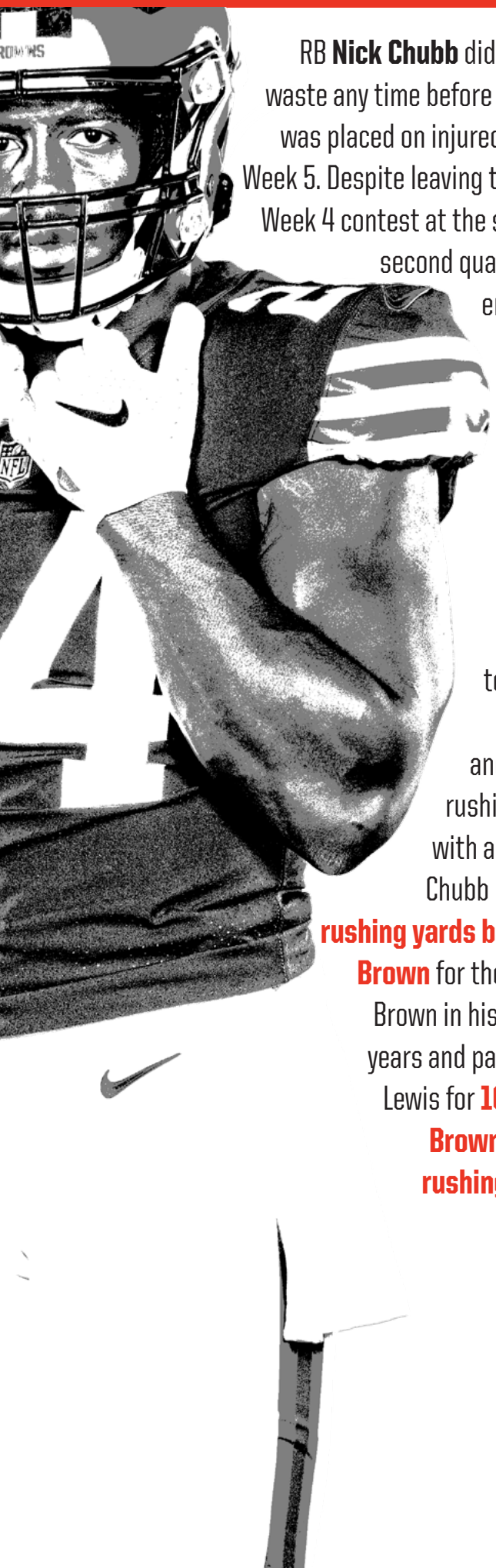

RB **Nick Chubb** didn't waste any time before he was placed on injured reserve in Week 5. Despite leaving the Browns' Week 4 contest at the start of the second quarter, Chubb enters Week 6 ranked **10th in the NFL** with 335 rushing yards, **tied for sixth** in rushing touchdowns with four and **fourth** in rushing average with a 5.88 mark. Chubb is also **973 rushing yards back of Jim Brown** for the most by a Brown in his first three years and passed Jamal Lewis for **10th on the Browns all-time rushing list with 2,825**.

Week 3 marked the 26th game Chubb has recorded at least 50 rushing yards in a game. His 26 games are only five back of Jim Brown's 31 for most by a Brown in his first three years.

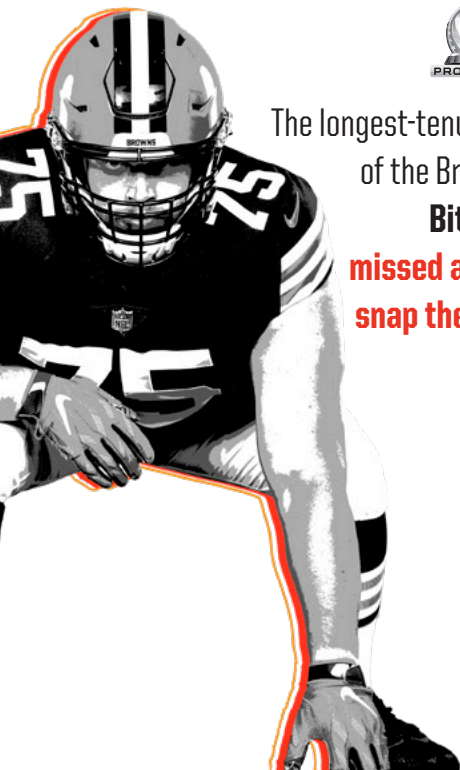
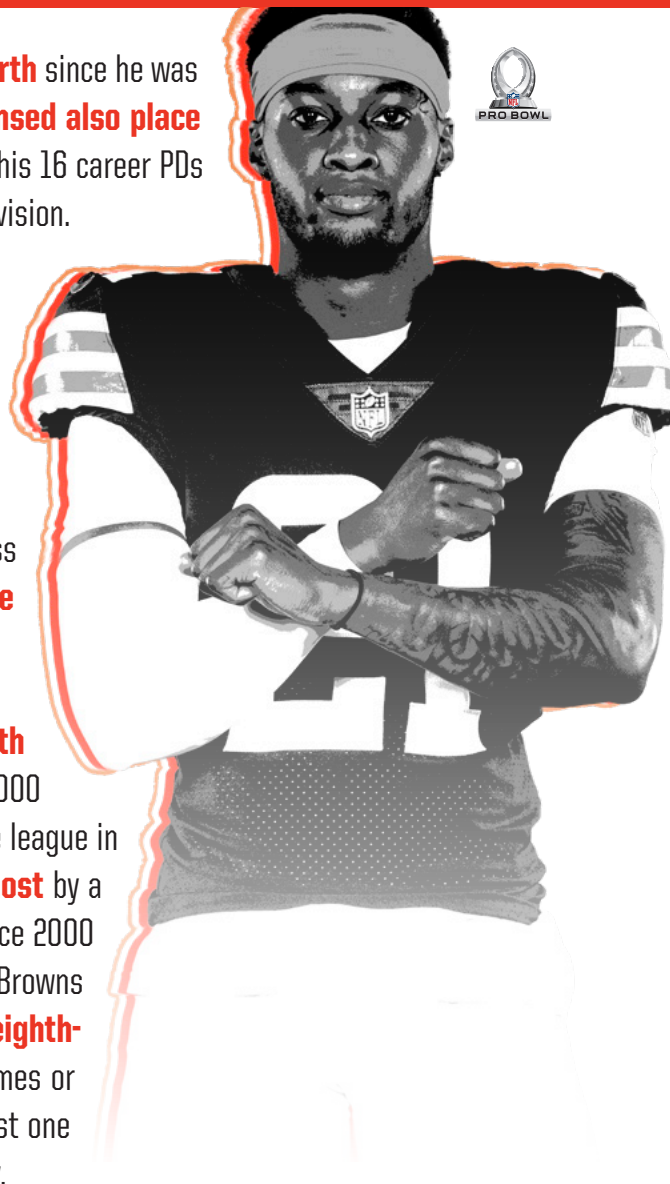
Chubb ranks second by a Brown since 1991 in carries for 10-plus yards with 81, but has the most carries for 20-plus yards (28) in the same timeframe.

CB **Denzel Ward** has posted the **most interceptions versus the AFC North** since he was drafted in 2018 with five. His **six total takeaways and 16 passes defended also place first**. His one interception returned for a touchdown is **tied for first** and his 16 career PDs against the AFC North are the **most in the NFL** by a player versus his own division.

In Week 2, he and CB **Terrance Mitchell** each notched three passes defended, **tying a career high** for Ward. The three pass breakups apiece tied Mitchell and Ward for the fifth most among all players in a single game this season.

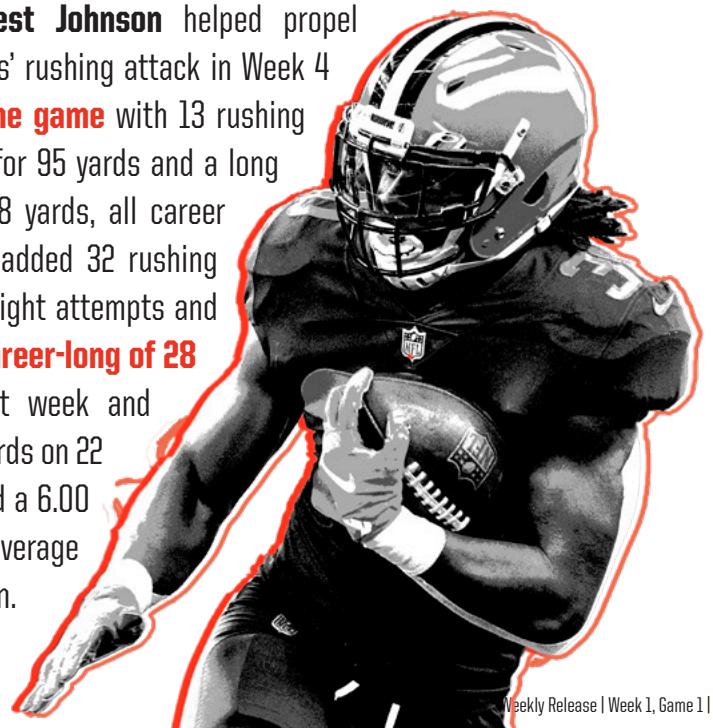
This year, Ward **leads the team** with seven pass breakups, **tied for second in the NFL** and **tied for the most in the AFC**. He's also added an interception.

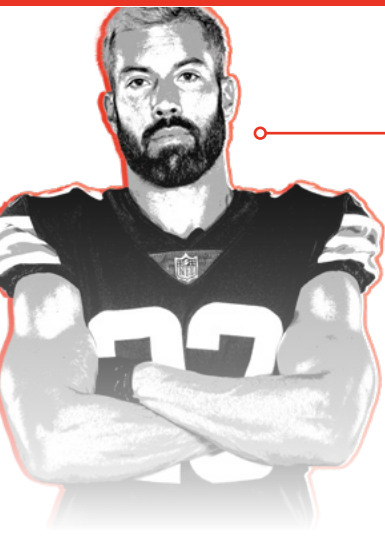
Ward's 29 career passes defended are **tied for the fifth** most by a Brown in his third year or younger since 2000 and are tied for **ninth** in the NFL since he entered the league in 2018. His 29 passes defended are also the **second most** by a Brown who has played in 29 career games or less since 2000 and his six interceptions are **tied for seventh** in Browns history in the same category. Ward is also tied for the **eighth-most** passes defended by an active player in 29 career games or less since 2000. His active streak of four games with at least one pass breakup is **the only one of its kind** in the NFL currently.



The longest-tenured member of the Browns, **G Joel Bitonio hasn't missed an offensive snap the past three seasons.**

RB **D'Ernest Johnson** helped propel the Browns' rushing attack in Week 4 and **led the game** with 13 rushing attempts for 95 yards and a long carry of 28 yards, all career highs. He added 32 rushing yards on eight attempts and tied his **career-long of 28 yards** last week and has 132 yards on 22 rushes and a 6.00 rushing average this season.





S **Andrew Sendejo** notched his **400th career tackle** in Week 4 and has 405 for his career. He added a forced fumble on the day, his first since 2014. He's third on the team with 25 tackles this season.

In Week 4, DE **Olivier Vernon** appeared in his **115th game** and recovered his first fumble since 2018. The nine-year vet has 54.5 career sacks since 2012 and 30 against the AFC, **eighth** among all defensive ends against the AFC in that span.



S **Tavierre Thomas** notched five special teams tackles in the team's win over Dallas in Week 4, the **second most by any NFL player** in a game this season. They were also the most by a Browns player since Leigh Bodden recorded five in 2004. Thomas is tied for **third in the NFL** with six special teams tackles this year.

DE **Adrian Clayborn's** career-high mark of **six sacks in a single game** (2017) is tied for the **most ever by a player in NFL history**. His two forced fumbles and fumble recovery in the same contest make him the **only player in history** to have **six sacks, two forced fumbles and fumble recovery** in the same game. His two sacks in 2020 are tied for second on the team, while his three TFLs are tied for the team lead.



DT **Sheldon Richardson** tied a career high with **three forced fumbles in 2019**. Since he was a rookie in 2013, Richardson places **tied for fifth** among all defensive linemen with **eight forced fumbles versus the AFC**. His two sacks in 2020 are tied for second on the team, while his three TFLs are tied for the team lead. He's the only Browns defensive lineman with a pass defense this year and leads the group with 17 tackles.

Last week, K **Cody Parkey** made all three of his field goal attempts and both extra point attempts. His 17 made extra points in 2020 are the **most by a Brown through the first five weeks of a season in history** and rank tied for third in the NFL this season. His perfect field goal percentage in 2020 **ties him for first in the league** with eight others.



S **Ronnie Harrison Jr.** recorded his first interception of the season and his **first career interception returned for a touchdown** last week. It was the first pick-six by a Brown since CB Denzel Ward on Dec. 8, 2019 versus the Cincinnati Bengals. The 47-yard return for a touchdown is **tied for the second-longest** in the NFL this season.

THE ROOKS



Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020. He spent the previous 14 seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, where he moved up the coaching ladder from assistant to the head coach to offensive coordinator.

Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and remained with the organization under three different head coaches. After serving as assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, Stefanski spent two seasons (2014-15) coaching the tight ends and one season (2016) as running backs coach. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

In 2019, the Vikings posted a 10-6 record and earned their first road playoff win since January 9, 2005, after defeating the Saints, 26-20, in New Orleans. Three offensive players were selected to the Pro Bowl as RB Dalvin Cook and FB C.J. Ham were each named to their first career Pro Bowl with Cook voted a starter. QB Kirk Cousins was also named to the Pro Bowl.

In his first full year under Stefanski, Cousins set a single-season career high for passer rating with a 107.4 mark, fourth best in the NFL in 2019. Cousins also finished with a career-low six interceptions, while adding 26 touchdowns and a 69.1 completion percentage, fourth in the NFL in 2019. He set a Vikings record for completions in a season with 425 and finished with the second-most passing yards (4,298) and passer rating (107.4) in Vikings history.

With 1,135 rushing yards, Cook became the eighth player in Vikings history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season and the first since Adrian Peterson in 2015. Despite missing the final two games of the season, Cook finished fourth in the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and seventh in scrimmage yards with 1,654.

WR Stefon Diggs set a career high with 1,130 receiving yards, giving him back-to-back 1,000-receiving yard seasons for the first time in his career. Diggs finished fourth in the NFL with an average of 17.9 yards per reception in 2019.

Stefanski was elevated from quarterbacks coach to interim offensive coordinator in Week 15 of the 2018 season and promptly guided the unit to two of its best showings of the season. In his first game calling plays, Minnesota scored a season-high 41 points and recorded 418 yards of offense en route to a 41-17 victory over the Dolphins.

As quarterbacks coach in 2017, the Vikings were forced to go to their backup, Case Keenum, early in the season after starter Sam Bradford went down with an injury. Keenum, who had completed 58 percent of his passes previously owned a 9-15 career record as a starter, went on to complete nearly 68 percent of his throws with 22 touchdowns and seven interceptions while leading the Vikings to a record of 11-3.

In his lone season coaching the running backs in 2016, the Vikings battled injuries along the offensive line and to RB Adrian

Peterson that caused the runner to miss 13 games. The running game leaned on veterans Jerick McKinnon and Matt Asiata as the duo combined for 941 yards and eight rushing touchdowns.

As tight ends coach, Stefanski helped develop Pro Bowl TE Kyle Rudolph. In 2015, his unit helped clear the way for Adrian Peterson to lead the NFL in rushing with 1,485 yards.

Stefanski was elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach in 2009, where he had a hands-on role in one of the most successful offense seasons in Vikings history. Veteran QB Brett Favre signed with the team in mid-August and finished the season with 4,202 passing yards and 33 touchdowns. The Vikings finished the season 12-4 and won the NFC North.

Stefanski spent 2006-08 working directly with Head Coach Brad Childress on administrative duties and special projects. Stefanski first worked with Childress during Eagles training camp in 2005 as part of the team's operations department.

Stefanski spent the 2005 season at his alma mater, Pennsylvania, as assistant director of football operations, coordinating all aspects of the Quakers' day-to-day operations.

A team captain as a senior in 2003, Stefanski was part of one of the most successful stretches in the history of the Quaker football program. The team won three Ivy League titles (2000, 2002 and 2003), and went 10-0 in 2003 to become the first undefeated Penn team in a decade. During Stefanski's tenure, the squad posted a 42-7 overall record and a 32-3 mark in Ivy League play and he was twice honored as an Honorable Mention All-Ivy choice in 2002 and 2004.

Stefanski earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania and attended St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia.

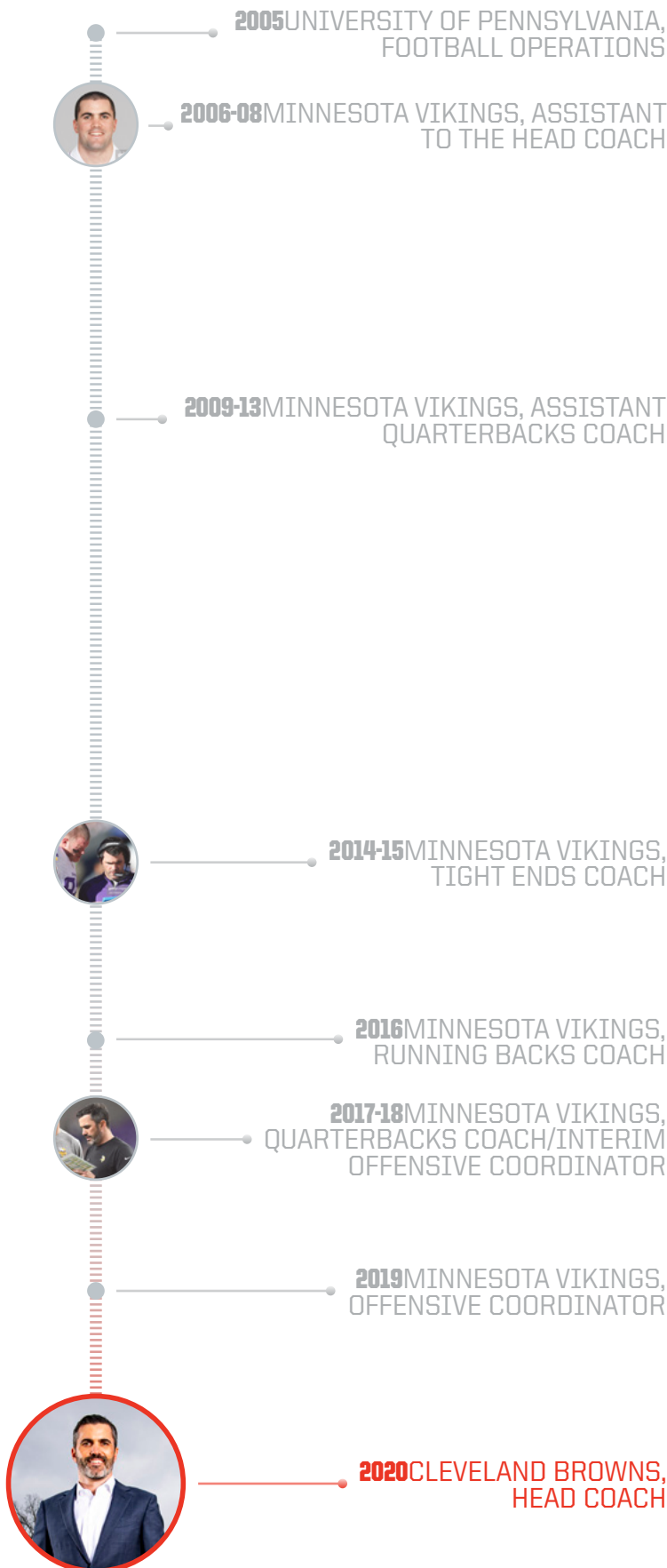
The Stefanski family has made a name in athletics as Kevin's father, Ed, was a basketball standout at Penn and works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons. He has previously held executive positions with the NBA's New Jersey Nets, Philadelphia 76ers, Toronto Raptors and Memphis Grizzlies.

Stefanski and wife, Michelle, have a daughter and two sons.

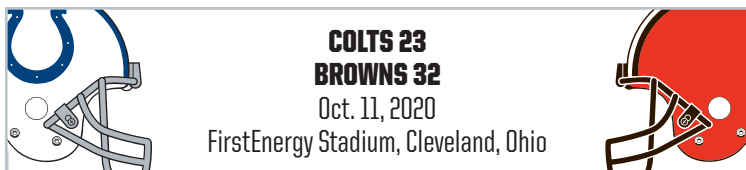

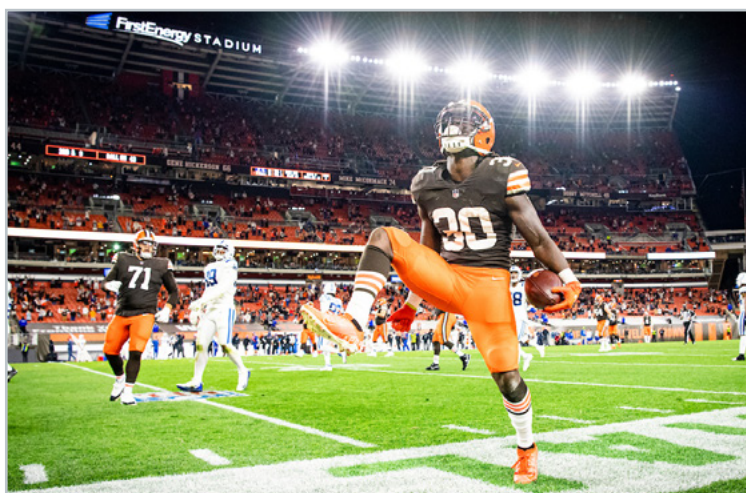
