Cleveland Browns vs. New England Patriots

FirstEnergy Stadium | Oct. 16, 2022

DE MYLES GARRETT

- DE Myles Garrett (63.5) passed Clay Matthews (62.0) for the most sacks in Browns' franchise history after logging two sacks today.

Most sacks by a Brown in team history

- His 63.5 career sacks rank first among all active players and No. 1 overall picks in their first 73 games.
 - Garrett surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer Derrick Thomas (63) for the fourth-most sacks by a player in his first 73 NFL games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.
- Garrett has posted the second-most sacks by a no.1 overall pick in their first six years, trailing Bruce Smith's 76.5.
- Since 2017, he has sole possession of fourth-most games with more than one sack.
- Garrett 32.0 sacks in 38 games at FirstEnergy Stadium since 2017 rank third in the NFL for a player in their respective stadium.
- Since 2017, Garrett ranks fourth in the NFL with 63.5 sacks, second in AFC behind T.J. Watt (73).
- He is also one of four players in the league to have at least 60 sacks (63.5) and 10 forced fumbles (13) since 2017 (Aaron Donald, T.J. Watt, and Chandler Jones).
- His 12-career strip-sacks are the most by a Brown since 2000.
- Garrett passed Simeon Rice to tie for ninth with Kevin Carter for most sacks by a first-round pick in their first six years.
- His 24.5 sacks in October since he was drafted in 2017 rank first and 20.5 since 2018 is second (Donald) in the NFL (*through 1 p.m. ET games*). His 17.0 since 2019 are the most in the league.
- Garrett took sole possession of sixth most games (12) tallying a half-sack and forced fumble since 2017.

RB NICK CHUBB

- RB Nick Chubb ran for 56 rushing yards on 12 carries today.
 - Chubb leads the league in rushing yards (649) and rushing touchdowns (seven).
- Chubb's 649 rushing yards this season are the fifth most by a Brown after the first six weeks of a season and the most since Jim Brown ran for 738 in 1965 through that same period.
- Today marked Chubb's 54th game tallying 50-or-more scrimmage yards, the most by a Brown in their first 64 career games.
- Chubb has reached 50 rushing yards in 52 games since he was drafted in 2018, three games from passing Jim Brown for most by a Brown in their first five years. The 52 games are also the most amongst all Browns in their first 64 games.
- The 52 games Chubb has rushed for more than 50 yards are the second most by an active player in their first five seasons behind Ezekiel Elliott (59).

- Chubb (5,431) is now 66 yards behind Greg Pruitt for the fourth-most rushing yards in Browns' history:

WR AMARI COOPER

- WR Amari Cooper tallied four receptions for 44 yards today. He leads the team in catches (31), receiving yards (348) and touchdowns (four).
- This was Cooper's sixth game in a row logging a receiving touchdown during home games, including all four home games this season.
- Cooper's 31 receptions are the tied for sixth-most by a Brown in the first six weeks of a season and are the second-most by a Browns WR, trailing only Terrelle Pryor Sr's 33 in 2016.
- Cooper's 50 receiving touchdowns match for fourth with Wes Chandler and Andre Johnson with the most by a top-five pick in their first eight years.
- He currently sits 27 yards back from passing Wes Chandler for the sixth-most receiving yards by a top-five pick in their first eight seasons.

TE DAVID NJOKU

- TE David Njoku caught the ball three times for 58 yards.
- Since Week 2, Njoku has posted the second most receiving yards by a TE in the NFL (282) behind Mark Andrews and ties Travis Kelce for third in receptions (23).
- Njoku is just 359 yards behind Kellen Winslow for the third-most receiving yards by a tight end in club history.
