

POSTGAME NOTES

Cleveland Browns at Baltimore Ravens

M&T Bank Stadium | Oct. 23, 2022

TEAM

- The Browns rank second in the league in both rushing yards (1,145) and rushing touchdowns (12) this season (*through 1 p.m. games*).

DE MYLES GARRETT

- The Browns' all-time sack leader, DE Myles Garrett (64.5) recorded one sack today.

Most sacks by a Brown in team history

- This was Garrett's third game in a row against Baltimore tallying a sack.
- Garrett became one of three in the NFL to record five sacks in each of the past six seasons.
- His 64.5 career sacks rank first among all active players and No. 1 overall picks in their first 74 games.
 - Garrett surpassed Pro Football Hall of Famer Derrick Thomas (64) and Von Miller (64) for sole possession of fourth-most sacks by a player in his first 74 NFL games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.
- Garrett passed Chandler Jones (64) for eighth-most sacks by a first-round pick in their first six years.
- Garrett has posted the second-most sacks by a no.1 overall pick in their first six years, trailing Bruce Smith's 76.5.
- Garrett 32.5 sacks in 35 games in opposing teams' stadiums since 2017 rank fifth in the NFL.
- Since 2017, Garrett ranks fourth in the NFL with 64.5 sacks, second in AFC behind T.J. Watt (73).
- He is also one of three players in the league to have at least 63 sacks (64.5) and 13 forced fumbles (13) since 2017 (Aaron Donald and T.J. Watt).
- His 25.5 sacks in October since he was drafted in 2017 rank first and 21.5 since 2018 is second (Donald-20.0) in the NFL (*through 1 p.m. ET games*). His 18.0 since 2019 are the most in the league.

RB NICK CHUBB

- Chubb rushed for 91 yards on 16 carries (5.6 avg.) with one TD. He currently leads the NFL in rushing yards (740) and rushing touchdowns (nine) (*through 1 p.m. games*).
- Chubb's 740 rushing yards this season are the fifth most by a Brown after the first seven weeks of a season and the most since Jim Brown ran for 777 in 1965 through that same period.
- Chubb's 44 career touchdowns tie for fifth in franchise history with Pro Football Hall of Famer Otto Graham:

- Chubb joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Jim Brown, Emmitt Smith and LaDanian Tomlinson, as well as Adrian Peterson to record at least eight rushing scores in each of their first five seasons.
- Chubb has three rushing touchdowns on opening drives this season, while no other RB has more than one, according to ESPN Stats & Info.
- Today marked Chubb's 54th game tallying 50-or-more scrimmage yards, the most by a Brown in their first 65 career games.
- Chubb has reached 50 rushing yards in 52 games since he was drafted in 2018, three games from passing Jim Brown for most by a Brown in their first five years. The 52 games are also the most amongst all Browns in their first 65 games.
- Chubb's eight rushing touchdowns tie for third most by a Browns player through the first seven games of a season:

- The 52 games Chubb has rushed for more than 50 yards are the second most by an active player in their first five seasons behind Ezekiel Elliott (59).
- Chubb (5,556) now holds the fourth-most rushing yards in franchise history after passing Greg Pruitt:

WR AMARI COOPER

- Cooper posted a game-high 74 receiving yards on three catches (24.7 avg.). He is tied with TE David Njoku for the team lead with 34 catches and paces the Browns with 422 receiving yards and four TDs.

- Cooper's 55-yard reception was the longest of the season by the Browns and the team's longest since Donovan Peoples-Jones recorded a 60-yard catch on Nov. 7, 2021.
- He currently has the sixth-most receiving yards by a top-five pick in their first eight seasons after passing Wes Chandler.

TE DAVID NJOKU

- TE David Njoku caught the ball seven times for 71 yards this afternoon.
- Since Week 2, Njoku leads the league in receiving yards by a TE in the NFL (360) and second in receptions behind Tyler Higbee (31).
- This was Njoku's fifth consecutive game notching 50 receiving yards. In addition, he has caught at least five passes and registered 50 receiving yards in four out of his last five games.
- Njoku needs 288 yards to pass Kellen Winslow for the third-most receiving yards by a tight end in club history.

OTHER NOTES

- QB Jacoby Brissett completed 22 of 27 passes for 258 yards with no interceptions for a 106.5 rating. It marks the second time this season that Brissett has completed 81.5 percent of his passes, tied for the highest mark of his career as a starting QB.
- G Hjalte Froholdt started his first career game, opening the contest at RG.
- LB Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah tallied six tackles (five solo), tied a career best with two passes defensed and added one forced fumble, his fourth career. The forced fumble in the fourth quarter was recovered by rookie DE Isaiah Thomas, the first of his career.
- Rookie CB Martin Emerson Jr. notched his first career sack on the first play of the third quarter. Emerson finished the game with four solo tackles and one sack.
- LB Deion Jones, who was officially activated to the 53-man roster, registered five tackles (four solo) and one tackle for loss in his Browns debut.
- DT Taven Bryan recorded his first sack as a Brown in the third quarter.
- P Corey Bojorquez notched the longest punt in the NFL this season after a 76-yarder in the second quarter. It was the second longest of his career after kicking a 82-yarder in 2021.

INJURY REPORT

- TE Pharaoh Brown left the game in the fourth quarter, was evaluated for a concussion and did not return.
- TE David Njoku injured his ankle in the second half and did not return.
- LB Jacob Phillips injured his shoulder in the fourth quarter and did not return..
