

POSTGAME NOTES

Cleveland Browns vs. Tampa Bay Buccaneers

FirstEnergy Stadium | Nov. 27, 2022

TEAM

- The Cleveland Browns improved to 19-24-2 all-time in overtime.
 - This marked the team's first overtime game since a 26-23 loss at Tampa Bay on Oct. 21, 2018 and the Browns first overtime win since a 12-9 victory against the Ravens on Oct. 7, 2018.
 - It was also the club's first overtime win via touchdown since a 30-24 victory against the Chargers on Oct. 20, 1991.
- The Browns increased their all-time advantage against the Buccaneers to 7-4 and improved to 4-1 at home against them.
- Head Coach Kevin Stefanski improved his record at FirstEnergy Stadium to 15-8.
- The offense ranks among the NFL leaders in most rushing statistics (*through 1 p.m. ET games*), including rushing touchdowns (tied for first with 18), rushing yards (fourth with 1,698), rushing first downs (fourth with 101) and rushes of 10-plus yards (third with 56).
 - Under Kevin Stefanski's helm, the rushing attack ranks second in the league in rushing yards per game (148.7) and rushing scores (58).
 - The rushing attack has rushed for 150 yards or more in seven games in 2022, the third most in the league.
 - The 18 rushing TDs by the Browns offense rank tie for the fifth with the 1955 team for the most by a Browns team in the first 11 games of a season.

DE MYLES GARRETT

- The Browns' all-time sack leader, DE Myles Garrett (68.5) recorded 1.5 sacks and three tackles this afternoon. He has a team-leading 10 sacks on the season (tied for fourth in NFL).
- Garrett's double-digit sacks on the season makes him as the only Brown to accomplish the feat for five straight seasons.

- His 68.5 career sacks rank first among all active players and No. 1 overall picks in their first 78 games.
 - Garrett surpassed Von Miller (67.5) for sole possession of fourth-most sacks by a player in his first 78 NFL games since 1982, when the individual sack became an official statistic.
- Garrett has posted the second-most sacks by a No.1 overall pick in their first six years, trailing Bruce Smith's 76.5.
- He is the 10th player in NFL history to record at least 68 sacks in their first six years.

- Since 2017, Garrett ranks third in the NFL with 68.5 sacks, second in AFC behind T.J. Watt (73.5).
- He is also one of three players in the league to have at least 65 sacks (68.5) and 13 forced fumbles (13) since 2017 (Aaron Donald and T.J. Watt).

WR AMARI COOPER

- Cooper posted a team-high 94 receiving yards on seven receptions this afternoon.
 - Cooper has tallied at least 70-plus receiving yards in four of his past five games.
- He has at least five catches and 75-plus receiving yards in five of his six home games this season.
- He leads team with 57 catches and paces the Browns with 792 receiving yards and seven touchdowns.
- He currently has the sixth-most receiving yards by a top-five pick in their first eight seasons with 7,868.
- His 43 first down catches this season are the most by a Brown through the first 11 games of a season since Kellen Winslow had 39 in 2007. Cooper's 43 currently rank seventh on the season.

RB NICK CHUBB

- Chubb rushed for 116 yards on 26 carries with one rushing touchdown. He currently sits second in the NFL in rushing yards (1,039) and second in rushing touchdowns with 12.
- Chubb hit the 1,000-yard mark today, becoming the first Brown to record four straight seasons with 1,000-yard performances since Jim Brown accomplished the feat in 1958-61.
- Chubb became the third player in NFL history with at least 950 rushing yards and eight rushing TDs in each of his first five seasons, joining Adrian Peterson and Pro Football Hall of Famer LaDainian Tomlinson.
- Chubb's 48 career rushing touchdowns passed Mike Pruitt for sole possession of third most in club history:

- Chubb has 100-or-more scrimmage yards in five of his past six home games this season.
- His 28 career games with 100-or-more rushing yards broke a tie with Leroy Kelly's 27 for the second most in franchise history:

- Chubbs' 28 100-yard games tie Derrick Henry for top in the league since 2018. It is also the most by a player in their first five seasons in that span.

TE DAVID NJOKU

- TE David Njoku recorded five receptions for 29 yards and one touchdown. His touchdown came with 32 seconds remaining in regulation and helped send the game to overtime.
- Njoku has the fourth-most receiving yards (2,218) by a tight end in club history.
- Njoku's 17 career receiving touchdowns are second on the Browns all-time list by a tight end.

OTHER NOTES

- DT Jordan Elliott recorded his second sack of the season.
- WR Donovan Peoples-Jones 29-yard punt return was a career long and the longest punt return by a Brown since WR Antonio Calloway recorded a 35-yard return at Baltimore on Dec. 30, 2018.
- WR Anthony Schwartz scored a 31-yard rushing touchdown on the first drive of the game, his first rushing score of his career. Schwartz now has two career TDs (one receiving and rushing).
