

REMEMBERING NICK MANGOLD

Drafted in the first round of the 2006 NFL Draft (29th overall), C Nick Mangold played 11 seasons with the New York Jets between 2006-16.

He appeared in 164 regular season games with the Jets, the 12th most in franchise history, and the second-most this century behind only Shaun Ellis (170). Including the playoffs, Mangold suited up for 171 games, starting in every single one of them, including back-to-back AFC Championship games (2009-10).

Mangold earned seven Pro Bowl selections throughout his 11-year playing career, including consecutive nods between 2008-11, and again between 2013-15. His seven Pro Bowl appearances are one shy of the franchise record held by Hall Of Famer Winston Hill.

In addition to his seven Pro Bowls, Mangold was named to three All-Pro teams, earning first-team in 2009 and 2010, and second-team in 2011.

He was inducted into the New York Jets Ring of Honor on September 25, 2022, and is one of 52 modern-era semifinalists for the Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2026.

500+: Led by QB **Justin Fields** and RB **Breece Hall**, the Jets totaled 502 yards of offense in the Week Eight win (10/26), marking the 17th game in franchise history with 500+ yards. The last time a Jets team generated 500+ yards of offense was in 2021, also versus CIN.

The Jets racked up 502 yards of offense without allowing a sack or committing a turnover. Those 502 yards were highlighted by 254 rushing yards, the third-most by any team this season. The win marked just the sixth occurrence since the merger that a team has generated 500+ yards, including 250+ rushing yards, while committing zero turnovers and allowing no sacks in the same game. No Jets team before Sunday had ever accomplished the feat before.

The Jets offensive line combination of LT **Olu Fashanu**, LG **John Simpson**, C **Josh Myers**, RG **Joe Tippmann**, and RT **Armand Membou** has started every game this season and has been a major factor in the team's success on the ground.

The offensive line has paved the way for the offense to rush for 2.52 yards per carry before contact, the best mark in the NFL, and 0.44 yards more than the next closest team (KC).

DECLINE IN PENALTIES: Since Week Six, the Jets have committed just 15 penalties (5.0 per game), the second fewest among all teams in that stretch, while only 11 were accepted, the fewest by any team. After the team averaged 8.4 penalties per game the first five weeks of the season, the 3.7 accepted penalties per game by the Jets since Week Six are the fewest in the League.

The Jets have surrendered just 66 penalty yards since Week Six, good for 22 yards per game, both the fewest by any team in that stretch.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES: The Jets entered the fourth quarter trailing 31-16 in Week Eight (10/26), before going on a 23-7 run to close out the game. The team's 23 fourth quarter points are the second-most by a Jets team this century behind only the Monday Night Miracle vs. MIA in 2000.

Hall's touchdown pass to TE **Mason Taylor** gave the Jets the lead with 1:54 remaining in the game. It marked just the second touchdown pass by a non-QB to take the lead after the 2:00 minute warning this century, joining Jets legend and Hall of Fame running back, Curtis Martin.

Hall owns the 12th-most rushing yards in the NFL (581), in addition to the 12th most scrimmage yards (759).

FIELD[S] DAY: QB **Justin Fields** completed 65.6% (21/32) of his passes for 244 yards and one touchdown, adding 31 yards on 11 carries, leading an offense that generated 502 yards, the most by a team in Week Eight, the fifth-most by a team this season, and the second-most by a Jets team across the last five seasons. **Fields'** touchdown pass marked the 50th of his career, becoming just the 13th player with 50+ passing and 20+ rushing touchdowns within their first five seasons in NFL history.

In only seven starts, **Fields** has rushed for 288 yards, already the fifth-most by a Jets quarterback in a single season. With his 31 rushing yards in Week Eight, **Fields** surpassed Ryan Fitzpatrick for the fifth-highest single-season total by a Jets quarterback. He is now 166 yards away from surpassing Al Dorow for the most rushing yards by a Jets quarterback in a season in franchise history.



BOUNCEBACK ISAIAH: WR **Isaiah Williams** had a career game in Week Eight (10/26), tallying 31 yards on three receptions and 25 yards on one carry, 38 yards on three punt returns and 132 yards on five kickoff returns, earning AFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. There have only been 11 occurrences by nine different players since 2000 featuring 25+ yards rushing, receiving, and on punt and kickoff returns. Of the nine players, seven have made at least one Pro Bowl appearance, and six have notched two+ nods.

Williams was at his best in the fourth quarter, returning a kickoff 37 yards and a punt 21 yards, the longest by any player in Week Eight, with both returns leading to touchdowns for the Jets offense. **Williams'** performance marked just the second time over the last five seasons (since 2021) that a player has logged both a 30+ yard kickoff return and a 20+ yard punt return in the fourth quarter, joining KC WR Nikko Remigio (Week Six 2025)

Williams tallied a 15+ yard play rushing, receiving, and on punt and kickoff returns, with each of those plays eventually leading to points for the Jets offense.

- His 25-yard rush set up a field goal in the second quarter.
- His 15-yard reception setup another field goal in the second quarter.
- His 37-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter led to a Jets touchdown.
- His 21-yard punt return in the fourth quarter helped setup the game-winning touchdown.



STICKY COVERAGE: The Jets defense held CIN to just 39 passing yards in the second half in Week Eight (10/26), the second-lowest mark by any team in Week Eight and the lowest allowed by a Jets defense in the second half this season.

On the season, the Jets defense has allowed an average of 136.0 yards per second half, the sixth-lowest mark among all teams in the League, including a League-low 67.1 passing yards per second half.

CB **Brandon Stephens** was targeted four times on 36 coverage snaps in Week Eight, and allowed only one reception for six yards. **Stephens'** 25.0% completion percentage allowed when targeted was tied for the second-lowest mark in Week Eight, according to Next Gen Stats.

Acquired via trade in Week Four, CB **Jarvis Brownlee Jr.** has logged 50.0%+ snaps in each of the last three games (since Week Six), where he has registered the second-most tackles on the team (19), including one tackle for loss, one forced fumble - the team's first takeaway of the season - and two passes defended.



SPECIAL PLAYS: The Jets special teams has been one of the best in the League this season, highlighted by P **Austin McNamara**, K **Nick Folk**, and a return unit that has featured seven different players return at least one kickoff in 2025. In the first eight games of his career, **McNamara** has punted 31 times for 1,355 net yards, generating a net average of 43.7, the seventh-best mark in the League.





ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON

CHAIRMAN

ROBERT WOOD JOHNSON, a member of the founding family of Johnson & Johnson, has built upon his family’s proud legacy of achievement as a successful businessman, compassionate philanthropist, civic leader, and diplomat.

Upon purchasing the team in 2000, Johnson established his commitment to a culture of success built on three key elements: passionate players, supportive fans, and a new stadium. Under his leadership, the Jets entered their new home field, MetLife Stadium, an award-winning venue that has been ranked as the #1 highest grossing venue in the world, recognized by Billboard as stadium of the decade, and the host of the 2026 FIFA World Cup Final. He also moved the Jets into the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center, a world-class 224,000 square-foot complex that united the entire organization, and provided the perfect facility for everyone—players, coaches, and staff—to continually improve and excel.

Ambassador Johnson led the search process for the team’s head coach and general manager vacancies, which began during the 2024 season. He implemented a comprehensive, 360-degree hiring approach, focused on researching, identifying, and interviewing qualified candidates to gain a thorough understanding of their capabilities, cultural fit, and potential to lead the organization to a world championship. Johnson also embraced emerging technologies, incorporating artificial intelligence to provide an additional layer of insight. He held informational meetings with former NFL head coaches and executives and partnered with psychological professionals who worked alongside the team to assess each candidate’s strengths and weaknesses, and to develop models that could predict their likelihood of success.

Johnson’s approach led to a modernized, data-informed hiring process that integrated football expertise with advanced analytics and behavioral insights, setting a new standard for how teams and businesses approach leadership searches. His strategic vision ushered in a new era for the organization, now under the direction of Head Coach Aaron Glenn and General Manager Darren Mougey. Glenn, a 15-year NFL veteran, was selected by the Jets in the first round of the 1994 NFL Draft and previously worked with the Ambassador as both a player and as a scout. Mougey got his start in the League as a scouting intern with the Denver Broncos and worked his way up to assistant general manager in just 10 years.

In 2017, Johnson was appointed the U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom. As ambassador, he strengthened the ‘Special Relationship’ between the US and the UK, by promoting security and economic prosperity over a range of issues from trade to cyber security policies.

While in London, the Ambassador resided in the historic Winfield House, receiving world leaders including Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and on multiple occasions, President Donald Trump. Ambassador Johnson led the relocation of over 1,000 employees from the Embassy’s historic location at Grosvenor Square to a new state-of-the-art headquarters at Nine Elms. When the pandemic struck London, he then directed those employees in the remote, effective, and efficient operation of the Embassy to continue to serve and promote the United States’ interests in the United Kingdom. Throughout his tenure at the Embassy, Ambassador Johnson engaged with government leaders and the British people, traveling extensively throughout the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland to hear local concerns and emphasize the ‘Special Relationship.’



Beyond the field, Ambassador Johnson's philosophy of a successful team celebrates the crucial role of fans, as well as the significant role the team plays in the community. In this spirit, the team, through the New York Jets Foundation, positively influences the lives of young people in the area by expanding youth football, preventing bullying, and promoting social justice, particularly in disadvantaged communities. Among the Foundation's programs is the Jets and Nike Girls Flag Football League, encompassing both New York and New Jersey. Launched in 2021, the league has seen over a 1,000% increase in participating teams in just four seasons, sparking New York and New Jersey to officially sanction the sport a varsity and pilot program in each state respectively. Ambassador Johnson's support for girls' flag football garnered industry recognition, as the Jets were honored with a 2024 Front Office Sports Most Impactful Award and received an ESPY nomination for Sports Humanitarian Team of the Year in 2023. Most recently, Johnson supported the creation of the first NFL Girls Flag Football League in both the United Kingdom and Ireland.

In 2022, the Jets announced a \$1 million donation to help aid the people of Ukraine, with the money distributed among various organizations, each receiving \$100,000, over the course of a year. For Johnson, the events in Ukraine are personal; his wife, Suzanne, grew up in a Ukrainian neighborhood in New York. Her mother, Marie, was born to Ukrainian immigrant parents while Suzanne's father, Stefan Ircha, was originally from Ternopil, a town outside of Kyiv, and immigrated to the United States after WWII. In 2022, the Johnson family traveled to Poland to meet with Ukrainian refugees and understand firsthand how the unprovoked invasion has impacted their lives.

Chief among Ambassador Johnson's healthcare initiatives is the support for lupus research. In 1999, he founded the Alliance for Lupus Research (now the Lupus Research Alliance). This was the first organization devoted exclusively to finding new methods to prevent, treat, and ultimately cure lupus. Thanks to his leadership, the organization has dedicated more than \$259 million for research grants and achieved the major milestone of funding research which set the stage for the recent FDA approval of three new treatments for this autoimmune disease.

Over many years, Ambassador Johnson has been active in philanthropy and civic affairs, including past roles as an Honorary Trustee of the Wildlife Conservation Society and a past board member of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center and the Peregrine Fund. The Ambassador also served as a Trustee and a Trustee Emeritus of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the nation's largest philanthropic organization devoted exclusively to promoting health and healthcare for Americans.

Currently, the Ambassador is an active member of the NFL's Finance Committee, Investment Committee, and Stadium Committee.





CHRISTOPHER JOHNSON

VICE CHAIRMAN

CHRISTOPHER JOHNSON has overseen pivotal changes within the organization and has been a key part of the New York Jets leadership since 2000.

Most recently, Johnson played an instrumental role in the search process that led to the hires of Head Coach Aaron Glenn and General Manager Darren Mougey.

Johnson is well respected and has built strong relationships with people throughout the NFL. In 2020, during the global pandemic and social unrest, Johnson addressed the team and discussed how they all—Johnson, coaches, executives, and players—could use their powerful platform to influence positive change. He proudly stood with the players and worked with them on initiatives promoting more inclusivity. These efforts continue today.

Johnson currently serves as an active member of the NFL's Media Owned and Operated committee.

Johnson is active in various educational endeavors and local philanthropy, supporting a range of initiatives, including charter school construction, youth sports and the encouragement of public discourse and exchange of ideas through debating societies.





HYMIE ELHAI

PRESIDENT

HYMIE ELHAI (pronounced HI-me EL-hi) begins his seventh season as the president of the New York Jets after his appointment in 2019. Now in his 26th year with the team, Elhai’s impact is felt throughout the organization.

Under Elhai, who has garnered League and industry respect by his peers during his tenure, the Jets have solidified their business staff’s senior leadership, as he oversees all team business operations. Elhai’s leadership has helped the Jets reach unprecedented growth through all aspects of the business, including sponsorship, sales, and content, leading to several organizational accolades and industry recognitions, including a 2023 NJBIZ Best Places to Work honor. Entrusted by Chairman Robert Wood Johnson, Elhai has helped form the foundation that has moved the Jets toward their goal of being a sustained, winning, and innovative franchise on and off the field.

Elhai has remained committed to redefining the organization through his steady hand of leadership and strategic planning, by setting clear goals and a mission that fosters a cohesive environment and a standard of excellence. To that end, this offseason, Elhai worked closely with team ownership on the search process that led to the hires of Head Coach Aaron Glenn and General Manager Darren Mougey, signifying a new era for the team. Elhai has played a pivotal role in facilitating a seamless transition for the newly hired football leadership, ensuring organizational alignment across ownership, football operations, and the business staff.

Throughout his tenure as President, Elhai has prioritized organizational efficiency by fostering and encouraging cross-departmental collaboration. He recognizes that the mission extends beyond internal operations alone, placing a strong emphasis on business initiatives that elevate fan engagement and deliver a more personalized fan experience.

In partnership with the New York Giants and MetLife Stadium, Elhai helps oversee MetLife Stadium, the home of the Jets and the host of premier events including the 2026 FIFA World Cup Final. He played a pivotal role in the building’s naming rights deal, a 25-year agreement established in 2011. The venue has been named the “Highest Grossing Stadium of the Year” nine times by Billboard during Elhai’s tenure, the most by any stadium in the world since its opening in 2010.

Ahead of the 2024 season, Elhai oversaw the launch of the organization’s rebrand, featuring three versions of the new “Legacy Collection” uniforms, in addition to updated primary and secondary logos. Throughout the process, Elhai emphasized a commitment to progress, remaining innovative, and delivering excellence to players and fans with a timeless look that honors the team’s heritage.

Elhai originally started with the organization as an intern in 2000 and has since held a variety of leadership positions, culminating in his appointment as team president. Most recently, he served as the club’s senior vice president, business affairs and general counsel, where he was responsible for all legal aspects of the team, including sponsorship, licensing, event, digital media, production and broadcasting agreements, and all employment related matters. Additionally, in that capacity, Elhai helped the football administration on all planning initiatives.

A Sports Business Journal Forty Under 40 honoree, Elhai received the Distinguished Alumni Award from Rutgers School of Law at their Alumni Recognition Gala in October 2021. He currently serves as a member of the NFL’s CBA player benefits plans committee.

Elhai is a graduate of Rutgers Law School and The Johns Hopkins University.

DARREN MOUGEY (pronounced: MOO-GEE) was named general manager of the New York Jets on Saturday, January 25th, 2025. Mougey brings over a decade of NFL personnel experience to the Jets after working with the Denver Broncos for the last 13 seasons, where he rose from scouting intern to assistant general manager in just 10 seasons.

“Darren is a trusted NFL executive who has experience working with an impressive collection of football leaders,” said Jets Chairman Robert Wood Johnson. “He is a proven talent evaluator who impressed us with his vision for this team. His partnership with Coach Glenn will revitalize this organization. I am proud of the thorough search we undertook and that it led us to the two best individuals to lead our football team going forward.”

Mougey’s front office journey started in 2012 as a scouting intern, as he climbed the ranks to assistant general manager (2022-24). For the Broncos, he held six different roles within the personnel department for three different owners/chief executives, two different general managers, and six different head coaches. Notably, he worked as an area scout in 2015 when the Broncos won Super Bowl 50. In his 13 seasons with the club, Mougey was part of four AFC West titles (2012-15), two AFC Championships (2013, ‘15), and one World Championship (2015).

“I could not be more excited to take on this responsibility with Aaron Glenn as we work to build a championship team that will make the Jets fans proud,” Mougey said. “Every successful team has alignment with its leadership, and it starts at the top, with ownership. It includes the head coach, and the general manager, and the president to build a world class organization, and we have that here with the Jets.”

“I will lead our personnel staff as we acquire, develop, and work to retain players that fit our team and culture, and we will do this in complete partnership with the coaches. Our philosophy will be to draft, develop, keep our own, and be disciplined and strategic in free agency. There is no more important part of any sports organization than the players, period. It’s about the players, and we have a good foundation of players here right now that we’re going to continue to add to, and we’re going to give those players everything they need to be successful and reach their potential.”

In his most recent role as assistant general manager (2022-24) for the Broncos, Mougey assisted general manager George Paton in all personnel decisions, and before that as the director of player personnel (2021), he oversaw the day-to-day operations of the pro and college scouting departments. Since 2021, the Broncos have had nine All-Pro seasons by six different players, with five of them, Zach

Allen, Nik Bonitto, Quinn Meinerz, Marvin Mims, and Patrick Surtain II, drafted or signed in that span.

As Denver snapped an eight-year postseason drought in 2024, Mougey helped acquire all but four of the 26 players that started at least five games for the Broncos in his four years as director of player personnel and assistant general manager.

Of those 26 players, 13 were drafted or signed as undrafted free agents, with seven of the 13 selected in rounds four through seven or signing after not being selected. The Broncos had only two first-round picks in the last four years, selecting All-Pro cornerback Surtain II (2021) and starting quarterback Bo Nix (2024).

Among his key pro defensive acquisitions, defensive lineman Allen registered a single-season best in sacks (8.5) in 2024 after signing in 2023, while safety Brandon Jones logged a single-season high in interceptions (three) in 2024 after signing in the same offseason.



A former player himself, Mougey was a quarterback and wide receiver at San Diego State (2004-08). A quarterback his first three seasons, he threw for 615 yards and two touchdowns, sharing a quarterback room in 2004 with Vikings Head Coach Kevin O’Connell and Jets Offensive Coordinator Tanner Engstrand. He spent his final two seasons with the Aztecs at wide receiver, where he caught 66 passes for 805 yards and six touchdowns.

An undrafted free agent signing by Atlanta following the 2009 NFL Draft, Mougey spent time in training camp with the Falcons (2009) and Cardinals (2010) before beginning his career in the front office with the Broncos (2012).

A Scottsdale, AZ native, Darren and his wife, Hannah have two children, Emmett and Marlow.

“I believe there is a type of brand that we want our players to play with and it’s a physicality, it’s a toughness. You’re going to feel it, but it’s smart, tough, aggressive, resilient players.”

31 years after he was selected by the team in the first round of the 1994 NFL Draft, **AARON GLENN** was named the 22nd head coach of the New York Jets. Glenn brings 28 years of NFL experience, 15 as a player (eight with the Jets), two as a scout (both with the Jets), and 11 as a coach before beginning his time as head coach.

“This place is special for me. From the time I was drafted and practiced on Long Island, to the time I came back as a scout in New Jersey, this organization has always felt like home. There is nothing better than having my start here as a player, here as a scout, and now here as a head coach. I am ready for it.”

Glenn will work closely with newly appointed General Manager Darren Mougey to lead the organization at the highest level. “Coach Glenn’s partnership with Darren will revitalize this organization,” said Chairman Robert Wood Johnson.

Aligned in their vision and approach, Glenn and Mougey share the common goal of building a winning organization that is built on sustained success. “We have a shared vision on how we’re going to do things,” said Glenn. “There’s nothing better in the world than having ownership that’s committed to winning, and then being able to partner it with a GM that has a shared vision that you have.”

Leading the Jets is something Glenn does not take lightly, something he embraces.

“We are the freaking New York Jets, we are built for this (expletive),” Glenn said during his introductory press conference. “Listen, I wanted this job, I interviewed for a number of them, but I wanted THIS job. I look forward to it, it is going to be a great ride, it really is.”

Throughout his career, Glenn never skipped a step – as a player, scout or coach. He started in junior college before Texas A&M. As a first-round pick with the Jets in 1994, he was part of a team that won 10 total games over his first three seasons. His next five, the Jets never had a losing record, making the postseason twice, including the AFC Championship Game in 1998.

When he wanted to get into coaching, he called his former head coach, Bill Parcells, who said, “You’re not going to coach yet. First, I want you to scout. I think you have a chance to be a head coach with your personality. But in order to be a head coach, you have to understand the personnel part of football.”

As prescribed, he started his scouting career on the bottom rung, joining the Jets as a pro scout (2012) for a year before going on the road as an area scout (2013). The 2013 Jets draft produced five

eventual NFL starters, including two future Pro Bowl selections in Geno Smith and Sheldon Richardson, the 2013 Defensive Rookie of the Year.

As a coach, he was an assistant defensive backs coach (CLV 2014-15), before becoming a defensive backs coach (NO 2016-20), and finally a defensive coordinator (DET 2021-24). He is one of only two active NFL head coaches to have been drafted by and played for the team they coach, joining Houston Texans head coach DeMeco Ryans.

The defensive coordinator with the Lions (2021-24), Glenn’s unit improved every season. After a 3-13-1 season in his first year (2021), Detroit won 36 games between 2022-24, the fourth most in the League, including a League best 27 in his final two seasons (2023-24).

In his final year (2024), Glenn’s defense finished in the top 10 in scoring defense and takeaways. A strong compliment to the offense, Detroit led the League with a +13.1 point per game differential - the fifth-highest margin by any team in the last 25 NFL seasons. The Lions finished fifth in the NFL in rushing yards allowed (1,672) and fourth in percentage of rushing first downs allowed (23.3%), while allowing the lowest opposing passer rating (82.0), and second lowest completion percentage allowed (61.1%). Detroit finished with the lowest third-down conversion rate allowed (32.4%), despite placing a number of key defensive players on injured reserve throughout the season, including five Week One starters.

Through his commitment to their development and success, Glenn elevated his players to reach individual accolades and milestones during his time in Detroit. Safety Kerby Joseph was named first-team All-Pro (2024) after leading the NFL in interceptions (nine), safety Brian Branch earned his first Pro Bowl honor (2024) after he recorded the most forced incompletions among safeties (12) and finished tied for fifth in passes defended (16), and defensive lineman Aidan Hutchinson earned Pro Bowl honors (2023) after recording 11.5 sacks and 83 pressures, the fifth most in the NFL.

As the defensive backs coach for the Saints (2016-20), Glenn developed key defensive playmakers in the secondary: Marcus Williams, Vonn Bell, C.J. Gardner-Johnson, and Marshon Lattimore, who was named Defensive Rookie of the Year (2017) and was selected to three Pro Bowls in his first four seasons. In his final season in New Orleans (2020), the defense finished fourth in the NFL in yards allowed per game (310.9) and fifth in points allowed per game (21.1). Additionally, New Orleans finished tied for first in the NFL in interceptions (18) and tied for the third-most takeaways (26).

In his first season coaching in the League (2014), Glenn, the assistant secondary coach with Cleveland, worked with a secondary unit that earned three Pro Bowl selections. It marked the first time the franchise sent three defensive backs to the League's all-star game in the same season. That year, the Browns led the NFL in opponent passer rating allowed (74.1), completion percentage allowed (57.1), and passes defended (99).

During his brief retirement from football, Glenn owned eight restaurants in the Houston area, before returning to the game he loves in 2012 as the general manger of the Houston Stallions of the Lone Star Football League, an indoor league in Texas.

A three-time Pro Bowl selection himself, Glenn entered the League as the 12th overall selection in the 1994 NFL Draft by the Jets. In his 15-year career (the first eight with the Jets), he played 205 games (176 starts) for five different teams and posted 41 interceptions, six of which he returned for touchdowns. Those 41 interceptions are still a top 25 total since 1994. He is one of just four cornerbacks in Jets history to play 100+ games for the team, joining James Hasty, Ray Mickens, and Darrelle Revis. His 24 interceptions with the Jets are tied for the second-most in franchise history since the AFL-NFL merger.

A Humble, TX native, Glenn was a four-year letterwinner in football, basketball, and track at Nimitz (TX) HS, before going on to Navarro College in Corsicana, TX and then Texas A&M. A 1993 graduate with a degree in business management, Glenn was a two-time All-American and the Aggies' all-time leader in passes defended in a season (20), season punt-return average (19.9), and punt return yards in a game (131). He was selected to the Texas A&M Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000.

Glenn and his wife, Devaney, have a son, Aaron II, and two daughters, Tristen and Rheagen. One of 11 children, he and his brother, Jason – a six-year NFL linebacker, spent a season as teammates on the Jets (2001).



15-Year NFL Veteran & Three-Time Pro Bowler

A JETS TAKEOFF: The New York Jets made Aaron Glenn the 12th overall pick in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Texas A&M. Glenn made an instant impact on the Jets defense, playing and starting in 15 of 16 games as a rookie, while registering 67 tackles and two forced fumbles. The Humble, Texas product finished sixth in the 1994 Defensive Rookie of the Year voting, and went on to play eight seasons with the Jets (1994-2001).

NO FLY ZONE: Glenn ranks as one of the most tenured cornerbacks in franchise history having played 121 games in New York, the second-most by any cornerback behind only Ray Mickens, his teammate for five seasons (1996-2001).

In eight seasons, Glenn registered 24 interceptions, which is still tied for the fourth-most in franchise history, and 99 passes defended, the second-most by a Jet ever behind only first-ballot Hall of Fame CB and Ring of Honor member, Darrelle Revis.

PRO BOWLER: Glenn was named to the Pro Bowl three times over the span of his 15-year NFL career, including two with the Jets (1997, 1998). He made an additional appearance as member of the Houston Texans (2002).

In his 1998 Pro Bowl Season, Glenn registered a career high six interceptions, which is tied for the eighth-most in a single season in Jets history.

Glenn is one of just six Jets defensive backs to be named to the Pro Bowl multiple times during their career in New York.



CHRIS BANJO begins his first season with the Jets as the special teams coordinator, having joined Aaron Glenn's staff in February. A 10-year NFL veteran, Banjo most recently served as a special teams assistant for the Denver Broncos (2023-24).

Last season (2024), Banjo helped Broncos returner Marvin Mims Jr. lead the League in yards per punt return (15.7), earning First-Team All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors. Additionally, under Banjo's lead, kicker Will Lutz recorded the fourth-best field goal percentage (91.2%) in the NFL, among kickers with at least 30 attempts.

As a unit, Banjo helped his group finish again near the top of the League in multiple special teams categories last season, including field goal percentage (sixth – 91.2%), yards per punt return (first – 15.7), and opponent yards per punt return (10th – 8.7).

In his first season with the Broncos (2023), Banjo's special teams unit ranked at the top in multiple categories, including punt return average (first- 16.3), punt return average against (second- 6.3), kickoff return average (eighth- 24.9), and kickoff return average against (ninth- 21.5).

Prior to beginning his coaching career, Banjo played 10 seasons in the NFL (2013-22), spending time with Green Bay (2013-16), New Orleans (2016-18), and Arizona (2019-22).

Banjo entered the League as an undrafted free agent with Jacksonville in 2013. Throughout his career, Banjo appeared in 131 regular season games (seven starts), totaling 85 tackles (59 solo), three interceptions, eight passes defended, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries, and 58 special teams tackles (49 solo).

During the 2020 season, Banjo set career highs in games played (13) and tackles (47), while logging 610 snaps on defense and special teams that season for Arizona.



While in New Orleans (2017-18), Banjo was part of a team that won consecutive NFC South Division titles and advanced to the NFC Championship game in 2018. Banjo was a key contributor on special teams, recording 13 tackles (12 solo) in the two-year span.

A graduate of Southern Methodist, Banjo appeared in 51 games (47 starts) for the Mustangs (2008-11), totaling 321 tackles (195 solo), four interceptions, 17 passes defended, three forced fumbles, and three fumble recoveries. He earned second team All-Conference USA honors as a junior (2010) and was an honorable mention All-Conference USA following his senior season.

A native of Houston, TX, Banjo and his wife, Jasmine, have two sons, Christopher Jr. and Cairo, and one daughter, Celine.

TANNER ENGSTRAND begins his first season as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets, after joining Aaron Glenn’s staff in February.

Engstrand brings over five years of NFL coaching experience, after previously serving in various offensive roles on Detroit’s coaching staff. Most recently, Engstrand held the role of passing game coordinator for the Lions (2023-24).

This past season (2024), Engstrand helped the Lions offense finish top of the League in multiple categories, including most points scored (564), most touchdowns scored (70), second-most total net yards (6,962) and the most first downs (410). Under Engstrand, Detroit became only the fifth team in NFL history to produce at least 6,500 total net yards and 70 touchdowns in a season (2024). Individually, Engstrand saw Detroit WR Amon-Ra St. Brown and WR Jameson Williams reach 1,000 receiving yards, with St. Brown earning First-Team All-Pro honors for the second consecutive season.

Additionally, Engstrand helped the 2024 Lions record the second most net passing yards (4,474), the highest completion percentage (72.4%), fourth most passing touchdowns (39), second highest passer rating (112.6), and second most yards per pass attempt (8.56).

Detroit’s pass game last season, led by QB Jared Goff, reached new heights under Engstrand with Goff ranking among the NFL’s most efficient quarterbacks in NFL history. Goff’s nine games with a 75.0%+ completion percentage established a new single season-best in NFL history (min. 15 attempts/game). Additionally, Goff recorded six games with a 130.0+ passer rating, one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL history to do so in a season (min. 15 attempts/game). Engstrand helped Goff finish second in the NFL in passing yards last season (4,629), second in completion percentage (72.4%), and second in passer rating (111.8).

During Engstrand’s first season as passing game coordinator (2023), Detroit finished second in the NFL in net passing yards (4,401), tied for fourth in passing touchdowns (30), and fifth in yards per attempt (7.60). Under Engstrand’s guidance, First-Team All-Pro St. Brown led the NFL in 100-yard receiving games (nine), ranked second in receptions (119), and third in receiving yards (1,515). Engstrand also saw Goff lead the NFL in passing first downs (227), finish second in passing yards (4,575), and fourth in passing touchdowns (30).

Prior to solely serving as the team’s passing game coordinator, Engstrand oversaw Detroit’s tight ends in 2022, in addition to elevated responsibilities in the team’s passing game. That season, Detroit’s tight ends combined for 12 touchdown receptions on the year, establishing a new single-season franchise record. Additionally, the Lions also had three different tight ends produce a multi-touchdown game in 2022, becoming the first team in NFL history to do so.

Engstrand began his NFL coaching career in 2020 as an offensive assistant with the Lions before being promoted to Offensive Quality Control for the 2021 season. Prior to that, he served as the offensive coordinator for the XFL’s DC Defenders (2019-20) after previously spending time at the University of Michigan as an offensive analyst (2018-19).

CHARLOTTE, NC  APPALACHIAN STATE

STEVE WILKS enters his first year with the New York Jets as the team's defensive coordinator, after joining Aaron Glenn's staff in February. Wilks joins the organization with more than 30 years of coaching experience, including 16 at the NFL level, and three Super Bowl appearances.

Wilks most recently served as the defensive coordinator for the San Francisco 49ers (2023), where he helped lead the unit to 12 wins, tied for the most in the conference, an NFC West title, an NFC Championship title, and an appearance in Super Bowl LVIII. Wilks' unit forced 39 three-and-outs of a possible 174 drives (22.4%), good for the eighth best mark in the NFL. Additionally, under Wilks' lead, the 49ers held opponents to 44 red zone drives, the second best in the NFL, and held opposing quarterbacks to an average passer rating of 79.6, the fourth best in the NFL. Wilks helped four 49er defenders earn Pro Bowl honors, and two earn AP All-Pro honors.

Wilks joined San Francisco after spending the 2022 season with the Carolina Panthers as the defensive passing game coordinator and secondary coach and later as the team's interim head coach. As the interim head coach, he led Carolina to six wins across their final 12 games, finishing in a tie for second place in the NFC South after opening the season 1-4.

Wilks spent the 2021 season as the defensive coordinator for the University of Missouri after serving as the defensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns in 2019. Under Wilks' direction, the Browns improved from 25th to seventh in passing defense that season, allowing 216.9 passing yards per game and registering 14 interceptions, tied for the eighth-most in the League.

Prior to his time in Cleveland, Wilks served as the head coach of the Arizona Cardinals (2018), where he helped lead a top 10 passing defense in the NFL. Additionally, Wilks helped CB Patrick Peterson earn his eighth-consecutive Pro Bowl selection.

Before earning his head coaching role in Arizona, Wilks spent six seasons (2012-17) in multiple defensive roles with Carolina. He originally joined the staff as the defensive backs coach (2012-14), leading a unit that finished seventh in passing defense (221.7) during that span. Wilks saw multiple Panthers players record some of their most successful seasons, recording career highs in tackles, interceptions, and passes defended. During the 2015-2016 seasons, Wilks was awarded additional responsibility, adding assistant head coach to his title.

In 2015, Wilks was part of a coaching staff that helped lead the Panthers to a Super Bowl appearance, leading the NFL in interceptions (24) and finishing sixth in scoring defense (19.3). Under Wilks' lead, CB Josh Norman earned First-Team All-Pro honors and a Pro Bowl selection, while DT Kawann Short was named to his first Pro Bowl and earned Second-Team All-Pro honors that season.

During the 2016 season with Carolina, Wilks saw his secondary finish tied for fourth in the NFL in interceptions (17). After his sustained success each season in Carolina, Wilks was named defensive coordinator for the 2017 season. That year, Wilks coached a unit

that jumped from 21st to seventh in total defense (317.1), finished third in rushing defense (88.1), and 10th in scoring defense (20.4). Additionally, Wilks helped LB Luke Kuechly achieve First-Team All-Pro honors and earn his fifth-consecutive Pro Bowl selection that season.

Wilks spent the 2009-11 seasons with the San Diego Chargers coaching their defensive backs. Over that span, the Chargers ranked fourth in both total defense (315.1) and passing defense (203.8), and in 2010, led the NFL in total defense (271.6). Wilks saw S Eric Weddle earn All-Pro recognition in back-to-back seasons.

Before his time in San Diego, Wilks served as the defensive backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2006-08. During the 2006 season, Wilks was part of a coaching staff that helped the Bears appear in Super Bowl XLI. Under his lead, the Bears finished second in interceptions (24), third in scoring defense (15.9), and fifth in total defense (294.1) that season.

Prior to coaching in the NFL, Wilks spent 11 years at the collegiate level, coaching defensive backs at the University of Washington (2005), the University of Notre Dame (2004), Bowling Green State University (2003), Appalachian State University (2001), and Illinois State University (2000). Additionally, Wilks served as the defensive coordinator for two different schools: Johnson C. Smith University (1995-96) and Savannah State University (1997-98). Wilks also served one season as head coach at Savannah State University (1999).

A native of Charlotte, NC, Wilks attended Appalachian State University (1987-91) where he earned his bachelor's degree in communications and played defensive back for four years. After graduating, Wilks attended training camp with the Seattle Seahawks (1992).

Wilks and his wife, Marcia, have two daughters, Marissa and Melanni, and a son, Steven James.

Prior to joining the Jets, Curry served as the inside linebackers coach with the Pittsburgh Steelers (2023-24), following four seasons in Seattle, serving as a defensive assistant (2019), defensive assistant/linebackers (2020-21), and assistant defensive line/defensive ends coach (2022). CHRIS HARRIS joins the New York Jets as the team’s defensive backs/pass game coordinator after two seasons with the Tennessee Titans, serving as the defensive pass game coordinator/cornerbacks (2023-24). For Harris, 2025 marks his 12th season coaching in the NFL.

During the 2024 campaign, Harris’ secondary unit in Tennessee allowed 177.3 net passing yards per game, second best in the NFL. Harris saw sixth-year safety Amani Hooker lead the Titans with a career-high five interceptions, tied for sixth-most in the League.

A former sixth-round selection by the Chicago Bears in the 2005 NFL Draft, Harris played safety in 101 games (88 starts) over eight seasons. He started in Super Bowl XLI where he intercepted a pass from Colts quarterback Peyton Manning. For his career, Harris registered 422 tackles, 16 interceptions, 13 forced fumbles, nine fumble recoveries, and 37 passes defended. A starter for four seasons at Louisiana-Monroe (2001-04), he started all 45 games he played, totaling 14 interceptions as a safety, and was named first-team All-Sun Belt.

STEVE HEIDEN enters his first season with the Jets as the offensive line coach after most recently serving as the tight ends coach with the Detroit Lions (2023-24). Heiden, an 11-year NFL veteran tight end, joins the staff with 12 years of coaching experience in various roles with the Arizona Cardinals and Detroit.

In his two seasons with Detroit (2023-24), Heiden guided tight end Sam LaPorta to a record-setting most receptions (146) by a tight end in their first two seasons in NFL history. Additionally, Heiden helped LaPorta become just the fourth TE since 1970 to total 1,600+ receiving yards in his first two seasons, joining George Kittle, Rob Gronkowski, and Jimmy Graham. His 17 receiving touchdowns since 2023 are tied for the most among all tight ends in the NFL.

Prior to his coaching career, Heiden played 11-seasons in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers and Cleveland Browns, totaling 201 receptions for 1,689 yards and 14 touchdowns. He was drafted by San Diego in the third round of the 1999 NFL Draft.

WIDE RECEIVERS

SHAWN JEFFERSON enters his fourth season with the New York Jets, and his first as part of Head Coach Aaron Glenn’s staff. 2025 marks Jefferson’s 21st season as a coach in the NFL, following a 13-year playing career.

Last season (2024), Jefferson guided wide receiver Garrett Wilson to career highs in receptions (101) and receiving yards (1,104), marking his third consecutive 1,000+ yard season, making him the first wide receiver in franchise history, and the 10th player in NFL history, to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons. Wilson’s 101 receptions were the second most in franchise history behind only Brandon Marshall (109). Additionally, Jefferson helped wide receiver Davante Adams rank ninth in the NFL in receiving touchdowns (seven), 10th in receiving yards (854), and tied for 12th in receptions (67) after being acquired via trade prior to Week Seven. On the season, Jefferson’s unit was the only one in the League to produce multiple 1,000+ yard, 75+ reception, and five+ touchdown receivers (Wilson and Adams).

Jefferson began his coaching career shortly after a 13-season playing career during which the former Charger (1991-95), Patriot (1996-99), Falcon (2000-02) and Lion (2003) wide receiver caught 470 passes for 7,024 yards and 29 touchdowns after entering the League as a ninth-round selection in 1991.

Last season (2024), Kusmirek helped an offensive line unit that saw rookie Olu Fashanu allow only 1.0 sack, the lowest among all rookie tackles (minimum 300 offensive snaps), and John Simpson allow only 20 QB pressures, tied for the sixth-best mark in the NFL among all guards with 1,000+ offensive snaps. Despite starting nine players on the offensive line throughout the season due to injury, Kusmirek helped guide a unit that allowed only 40.0 sacks, good for a 6.2% sack rate, with both figures ranking in the top half of the League.

Prior to joining the Jets, Kusmirek spent time at Rhode Island following four seasons at New Haven, where he helped lead the Chargers to two NE-10 Conference Championships (2021, 2023) and three consecutive NCAA playoff appearances (2021-23).

OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT

JUNIOR TAYLOR enters his third season with the New York Jets as an offensive assistant, after originally joining the organization as part of the NFL's Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship (2023). Taylor previously participated in the program during the summer of 2020 with the Tennessee Titans.

Across the last two seasons (2023-24), Taylor has helped wide receiver Garrett Wilson notch his second and third consecutive 1,000+ yard receiving season, making him the first wide receiver in franchise history, and the 10th player in NFL history, to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons in the League. Additionally, last season (2024), Taylor helped guide Wilson to career highs in major categories, including receptions (101), receiving yards (1,104), and receiving touchdowns (seven). His 101 receptions were the second most in franchise history behind only Brandon Marshall (109, 2015).

SR. ASSISTANT/PASS GAME COORDINATOR

SCOTT TURNER enters his first season with the Jets as the team's senior assistant/pass game coordinator, bringing 13 years of NFL experience to the team. He most recently served as the pass game coordinator and interim offensive coordinator with the Las Vegas Raiders.

During the 2024 season, Turner served as the Raiders pass game coordinator the first nine games of the season before being named the team's interim offensive coordinator in November. The offense saw improvement in all major categories under his leadership, increasing from 280.9 yards per game to 320.0 the final 10 games of the season. Additionally, the offense averaged 245.9 passing yards per game Weeks 11-18, the seventh best mark in the League, despite starting three quarterbacks during that time.

Turner is the son of former NFL Head Coach Norv Turner. The two coached together in Carolina, Minnesota, and Cleveland.

DEFENSIVE LINE

ERIC WASHINGTON enters his first season with the New York Jets as the defensive line coach, bringing nearly two decades of NFL coaching experience to the team. Prior to the Jets, Washington served as the Chicago Bears Defensive Coordinator for the 2024 season.

While in Chicago, Washington guided a Bears defense that produced an 8% sack rate per pass attempt, the 11th highest mark in the NFL. Additionally, Washington's unit held opposing offenses to a 46% efficiency rate in the redzone, the second lowest mark in the League, and to just a 67.6% success rate on goal-to-go downs, the ninth-lowest mark in the League.

Prior to his time in Chicago, Washington served as the defensive line coach for the Buffalo Bills from 2020-23. In 2023, he helped guide a defense that held opposing offenses to 307.2 yards per game, the ninth-best mark in the League, and to 104.6 rushing yards per game, the fifth lowest mark in the League. During Washington's tenure, the Bills recorded a sack rate of 9.8% per pass attempt, the third-best rate in the League. Additionally, Washington helped contribute to defensive end Leonard Floyd's success that season, as Floyd registered a career-high 10.5 sacks, tied for 10th most in the League.

In 2021, his defensive unit ranked sixth in NCAA Division III for passing defense, allowing just 132 yards per game.

Williams was selected by the Chicago Bears in the third round of the 2002 NFL Draft. He played seven games in his rookie season, starting three, and was named to the NFL All-Rookie Team in 2002. Williams also had stints with the Denver Broncos and Cleveland Browns, starting 15 of the 26 games he appeared in during his time with the Browns. He later played in the Canadian Football League with the Edmonton Eskimos.

ASSISTANT LINEBACKERS

NATHANIEL WILLINGHAM enters his fourth season with the New York Jets, and his first as the assistant linebackers coach, after joining the organization in 2022. He was promoted to defensive backs/nickelbacks coach prior to the start of the 2024 season. For Willingham, 2025 marks his seventh season coaching in the NFL, after five years at the collegiate level.

Willingham has helped the defense register a top five unit in football in each of the last three seasons, ranking fourth (311.1) in total defense in 2022 and third in both 2023 (293.2) and 2024 (318.8). Last season (2024), he helped the defense limit opponents to 192.6 passing yards per game and a 66.7% goal to go efficiency, the fourth and seventh lowest marks in the League respectively.

Prior to joining the Jets, Willingham spent three seasons with the Denver Broncos (2019-21) as a defensive quality control coach. During his time in Denver, the Broncos became the first team since 1995 to lead the League in red zone defense in consecutive seasons (2019-20).




