BEARS OPEN PRESEASON AT HOME AGAINST BROWNS

The Chicago Bears are set to open the 2026 slate by hosting the Cleveland Browns in Preseason Week 1. Kickoff from Chicago on Sat., Aug. 15 is set for Noon CT. The crew of Adam Amin, Stacey Dales and Jim Miller will have the call from the booth on FOX32 Chicago, as Jasmine Baker will provide sideline commentary. Jeff Joniak (play-by-play), Tom Thayer (analyst) and Jason McKie (sideline) will have the call on the Bears Radio Network airwaves. The television broadcast will also be aired on NFL Network outside of the Greater Chicago television region.

Chicago enters 2026 under the leadership of second-year Head Coach **Ben Johnson**. In his first year at the helm of the Bears, Johnson led Chicago to an NFC North Division title and 12 total wins, including 11 in the regular season. Johnson became the first Head Coach in franchise history to win a postseason game in their first year at the helm, as his 12 victories tied for the most by a first-year Head Coach in the history of the Bears. Johnson's offense finished the regular season with the fewest giveaways in the NFL (11), and the second-most points scored off of takeaways in the league (104). Defensively, the Bears registered an NFL-best 33 takeaways, including 23 INTs, for a league-leading +22 turnover differential. Chicago's defense held opposing offenses to just 13 points scored on their opening drive during the regular season No. 1 in the NFL. The Bears became the first NFL team to lead the league in both takeaways (33) and fewest amount of giveaways (11) since 2011. As a team, Chicago amassed 441 points scored last season, third-most in a single season in franchise history.

QB Caleb Williams set a franchise record with 3,942 passing yards in 2025, adding a 361-yard passing performance in the NFC Wild Card Round win over Green Bay, a single-game club record in the postseason. Williams led the Bears to an NFL-best seven fourth-quarter comebacks last season (postseason included), a single-season franchise record by a QB and tied for the second-most by any player in a season in league history. Rookie **TE Colston Loveland** led the Bears in receptions (58) and receiving yards (713) in the regular season, as his six receiving scores shared the lead among all rookie TEs. Loveland totaled 597 receiving yards over the final 10 weeks of the regular season, the most by any rookie in the NFL. **RB D'Andre Swift** (1,087) and **RB Kyle Monangai** (783) lead the rushing attack, as Chicago was the only team in the NFL with two 750+-yard rushers in 2025, with the help of **OL Joe Thuney**, who was named the first-ever NFL *Protector of the Year* at NFL Honors.

This season, the Bears are scheduled to appear in five primetime games and two standalone games, headlining seven premium regular-season matchups in 2026. Chicago's five scheduled primetime matchups tie for the most for the Bears since at least 2000. For the first time in franchise history, the Bears are scheduled to play games on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday in 2026. Returning to the Thanksgiving Day slate in 2026, Chicago is also set to appear on Christmas Day, headlining each of the two major holiday lineups in 2026, marking the first time in franchise history that the Bears play games on both Thanksgiving and Christmas in the same regular season.

Chicago will kick-off the regular season on the road against the Carolina Panthers in Week 1. Chicago's Week 1 matchup against Carolina will be the first-ever season-opening matchup between the two clubs and marks the first Week 1 road contest for the Bears since 2021. Kickoff from Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C. is set for 1 p.m. ET on Sun., Sept. 13.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

- +22** The Bears finished 2025 with a +22 turnover differential, the best in the NFL and the third-best by a Bears team in a season since at least the 1970 Merger. Chicago's defense totaled 33 takeaways, with 23 coming via INT, each of which led the league.
- 18** Chicago overcame an 18-point deficit to defeat the Packers in the NFC Wild Card Round last year, the largest postseason comeback in the NFL since 2022, the fourth-largest comeback overall in team history (reg. and post.) and the largest postseason comeback in franchise history.
- 7** The Bears are scheduled to appear in five primetime games and two standalone bouts in 2026, headlining seven premium regular-season matchups this season.

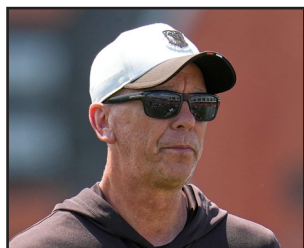

Ben Johnson was named Bears Head Coach of the Chicago Bears on Jan. 21, 2025, becoming the 18th full-time Head Coach in the franchise's history.

In his first season as Head Coach of the Bears, Johnson led Chicago to an NFC North Division title and 12 total wins, including 11 in the regular season. Johnson became the first Head Coach in franchise history to win a postseason game in their first year at the helm, as his 12 victories tied for the most by a first-year Head Coach in the history of the Chicago Bears. Johnson's offense finished the regular season with the fewest giveaways in the NFL (11), and the second-most points scored off of takeaways in the league (104). The Bears registered the NFL's No. 3-ranked rushing offense in 2025 (144.5 rushing yards per game), as the unit's 127 Big Plays were the second-most by any team in the league. Over the final 10 weeks of the regular season, Chicago amassed 109 points in the fourth quarter and OT, the most by any team in the NFL. The Bears culminated the regular season with 441 points scored, third-most in a single season in franchise history.

Johnson joined the Bears after serving as Offensive Coordinator (2022-24) for the Detroit Lions, where he led one of the most prolific offenses in the National Football League. Named AP NFL Assistant Coach of the Year in 2024, Johnson's offensive unit averaged a franchise-record 409.5 yards per game, helping the Lions average a league-high 32.4 points per game and accumulate 68 total offensive touchdowns – the most by any team in the NFL. Each of his three seasons coordinating Detroit's offense (2022-24), Johnson's group has finished in the top-five in the league in total offense, including a No. 2 ranking in 2024. Over his final two seasons (2023-24), no unit averaged more points per game (30.1) or net yards per game (402.2) than Johnson's with the Detroit Lions. Prior to Detroit, Johnson served seven seasons on the staff of the Miami Dolphins, working under three different head coaches. Over his seven years in Miami, Johnson worked in the capacities of Offensive Assistant (2012), Assistant Quarterbacks Coach (2013-15), Tight Ends Coach (2015), Assistant Wide Receivers Coach (2016-17) and Wide Receivers Coach (2018).

A native of Asheville, N.C., Johnson was a walk-on quarterback at the University of North Carolina, earning degrees in mathematics and computer science. Johnson and his wife, Jessica, have three children – Emory, Kennedy and Halle.

Todd Monken re-joined the Browns as head coach on Jan. 28, 2026. Monken has spent 26 seasons coaching at the college level, where he served as head coach at Southern Miss (2013-15) and helped Georgia to consecutive national championships (2021-22). He has also spent seven seasons as an offensive coordinator in the NFL, including the 2019 season with the Browns.

Most recently, Monken served as the offensive coordinator for the Baltimore Ravens from 2023-25. During his span, the Ravens finished near the top in several key categories including rushing yards (first with 166.9 per game), yards per game (second with 375.6 per game), points (third with 27.9 per game), yards per play (first 6.2), rush average (first with 5.31) and rushing touchdowns (third with 70). In 2023, QB Lamar Jackson was named NFL MVP. In 2024, the Ravens finished with the No. 1 offense for the first time in team history as the Ravens became the first team in NFL history with 4,000 yards through the air (4,035) and 3,000 yards on the ground (3,189) in a single season. The unit set a franchise record with 7,224 total yards of offense, the third-most in NFL single-season history.

Monken spent 2020-22 as the offensive coordinator at the University of Georgia. His innovative offense helped the school capture back-to-back CFP National Championships in 2021 and 2022, as Georgia went 29-1 over those two seasons.

During Monken's first stint with the Browns, he led an offense that featured RB Nick Chubb, who finished second in the NFL with 1,494 rushing yards, QB Baker Mayfield threw for 3,827 passing yards, while WRs Jarvis Landry and Odell Beckham Jr. each recorded 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Monken spent three seasons (2016-18) as offensive coordinator with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He also coached the wide receivers his first two seasons. During his three-year run as offensive coordinator, his offenses ranked first (415.5 in 2018), fourth (363.5 in 2017) and fifth (346.4 in 2016) in Buccaneers history in yards per game.

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Monken was a three-year letter winner at quarterback for Knox College. He and his wife, Terri, have one son, Travis.

- With 11 or fewer interceptions in the 2026 season, Williams would have the fewest through three seasons in NFL history (Min. 38 starts)
- With five fourth-quarter comebacks, Williams would surpass Derek Carr (12) for most fourth-quarter comebacks by a QB in their first three seasons in the NFL

TE COLSTON LOVELAND

- With 700 receiving yards, would become the third tight end in NFL history to have 700+ receiving yards in each of his first two seasons (Mike Ditka, Sam LaPorta)
- With at least 700 yards and six touchdowns, would become the first tight end in Bears history to reach both of those marks in consecutive seasons.
- With at least five receiving touchdowns, would rank inside the top-five for receiving touchdowns by a Bears player in their first two seasons

TE COLE KMET

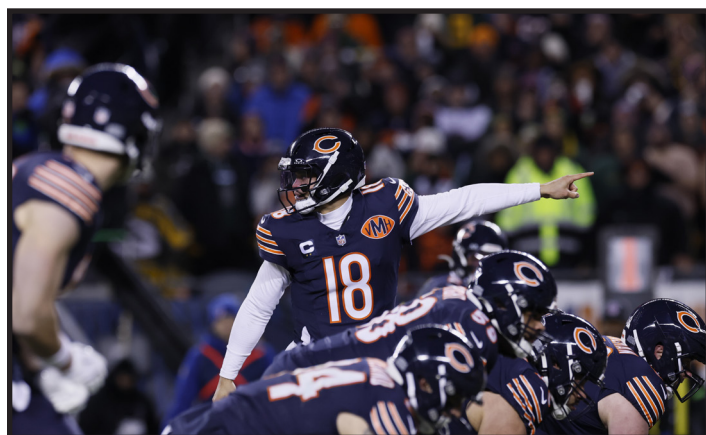

RECORD-SETTING DAY

In Chicago's 2025 Week 9 win over Cincinnati, Williams became the first player in NFL history with at least 275 passing yards, 50 rushing yards and 20 receiving yards in a single game, and became the first starting QB with two receptions in a game since 1953 (Baltimore Colts QB George Taliaferro).

Williams became the first Bears QB to register multiple passing TDs and at least one receiving TD in a single game since 1985 (McMahon) and the first NFL QB to do so since Bills QB Josh Allen did so in 2024 (W13).

CONNECTION BUILT

JUST GETTING STARTED

Over the final 14 weeks of the 2024 season, **QB Caleb Williams** completed 281-of-444 pass attempts for 2,911 yards and 18 touchdowns to just two interceptions, registering a 93.8 passer rating. Over the duration of the year, Williams set the franchise's record for most completions (351), passing yards (3,541) and passing touchdowns (20) by a rookie.

Williams reached 353-straight pass attempts without an interception, registering the fourth-longest stretch all-time by any passer in a single season. Williams' streak is the longest by any rookie QB in NFL history and a Bears record, as his nine-straight starts without an interception also set the record for most by any rookie and any Bears QB in a single season. Williams had four 300-yard passing performances this year, tied for the most by any player in a single season franchise history.

WEEK 1 WINNER IN DEBUT

In the 2024 season opener, **Williams** became the first Bears rookie quarterback to win the season opener since at least 1950 (per Elias). Williams joined teammate Tyson Bagent as the lone two Bears to win their first career starts as rookies over the last 20 years.

Since at least 1950, only five Bears rookie quarterbacks have won their first career start — Williams (2024), Bagent (2023), Craig Krenzel (2004), Rex Grossman (2003) and Jim McMahon (1982). Williams became the first Bears QB to register a fourth-quarter comeback win in their first career game since at least 1950, while becoming the fifth rookie passer to lead a fourth-quarter comeback and victory in their first career game and first career start.

HISTORIC DAY ON THE LONDON PITCH

In a 2024 Week 6 win at London's Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, Williams threw for a career-high four touchdowns on 23-of-29 passing (79.3 pct.) for 226 yards, registering a 124.4 passer rating. Williams became the first No. 1 overall pick in the Common Draft Era to win four of their first six career starts and the first Bears rookie to have a passing touchdown in four-straight games.

Williams also became the fourth rookie passer to register at least four passing touchdowns and 50 rushing yards in league history. Williams' four passing scores are the most by any rookie quarterback in an NFL International Series Game, as well as the most by any NFL passer in a game held at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium (since 2019). With a passer rating above 100.0, he became the first Bears rookie to do so in three-straight games since at least the 1970 Merger.

Williams became just the fourth player in NFL history to throw for four passing touchdowns, register a 75 percent completion rate and rush for at least 50 yards in a single game in NFL history. Of the previous three players to do so, Rodgers and Jackson were named NFL Most Valuable Player that same season, as Robert Griffin III was named NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

A SWIFT RISE

From the Bears bye week to the end of the regular season in 2025, Swift posted a 5.39 yards per attempt average, 25 rushes of 10+ yards, three 100+ yard rushing games and 75.0 rushing yards per game.
